



Pupil Premium Statement 2014/2015

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011. It is allocated funding for children from low-income families who are eligible for free meals or who have been eligible for free school meals in the previous 6 years. The level of premium for 2013/2014 was £900 per pupil and this has been increased for 2014/2015 to £1300 per pupil. Children who have been looked after for 1 day or more or were adopted from care on or after 30 December 2005, or left care under a special guardianship order or a residence order will also attract the pupil premium of £1900 per pupil. The pupil premium also applies to children whose parents are in the armed forces and is currently £300 per pupil.

How is this money being spent?

1. To provide additional teachers support in both key stages
2. To provide a Pastoral Team Manager with specific responsibility for attendance
3. To provide 1-2-1 tuition for pupils requiring additional support
4. To subsidise opportunities for experiential learning including school trips and resources
5. To provide targeted interventions
