Summary of PPG spending 2014/15

Objectives in spending PPG:

To maintain high standards in Reading through one to one intervention in Year 1. (Formally known as Reading Recovery) and to support children in Year 2 with targeted group work.

To support Pupil Premium children with out of school activities and educational trips.

To support with gifted and talented opportunities.

To develop communication and problem solving skills through Forest School Work

Summary of spending and actions taken so far for 2014-15 academic year:

Literacy Support.

One to one support has been ongoing from September 2013.

Targeted reading group has been in action from January 2014.

Support given to Y1, Y2, Y3/4 Y6

Financial Support

Support given to Residential and school trips.

Extra Curricular

A number of pupils have had the opportunity to take LAMDA exams to support their Literacy and confidence.

PSHCE

Forest School work has been ongoing from January 2014.

One to one support time for a child

Expenditure on THRIVE

Outcomes to date:

Literacy The one to one intervention has been very successful with pupils making on average 12 points progress in their reading between September and June. The Year 2 targeted group achieved at least National Expectations. The Year 3/4 children are either on track to achieved National Expectations or are closing the gap. The Y6 children all achieved at least National Expectations (Level 4). One child made 3 levels progress in reading.

LAMDA , all children successfully passed their exams, this also had a positive impact on Year 6 reading results.

PSHCE

Forest school activities have had a positive effect of behaviour and helped to develop the confidence of some of

the quieter children. Parents have given positive feedback. This is having a positive effect on classroom behaviour.

THRIVE is ongoing.

Financial Support

This has enable all PP children to take a full and active part in school life.

Planned spending and actions for 2015-16 academic year:

As last year, we will aim to further enhance the Forest School Programme and may look at other opportunities to support vulnerable pupils. The Governing Body has formed a PP Group to monitor this group of children.
