

Homework Timetable

The amount of time a child spends on homework should increase as the pupil moves through the school.

Reception Homework

Reception children should read their reading book every night and parents/carers should write a comment in the reading record to inform staff as to how their child did. Although not compulsory, 'Challenges' are set at the end of each week which children are encouraged to complete in the home-school book. Sounds homework is also set on a weekly basis.

Year 1/2/3/4/5 Homework

Children should spend around 5 to 10 minutes each evening reading and practising their times tables and number bonds.

Spelling homework is issued weekly and should be completed using the Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check method

Additional homework relating to English, Maths or Topic is also set on a weekly basis.

Homework will be closely linked to work children are doing or will be going to do in the future; it will not necessarily be written. It may consist of informal math games, finding out information or completing a simple science experiment for example.

Year 6/8 Homework

Homework is set in core subjects once every week and foundation subjects as required, usually every two weeks.

Weekly spellings are issued and 15 minutes of daily reading is expected.

5 minutes of mental maths per day including the revision of multiplication tables, calculation of multiples of ten, number bonds to 100 and decimal bonds to 1 is also expected.
