Provision	Impact
1:1 and small group teaching	Our SENCO took on additional teaching hours to focus work with individual children. This developed learning skills, confidence and readiness for secondary school.
Training for specific needs of vulnerable children	Individual staff members attended specific training looking at ways of supporting individual needs.
Back on track Maths Intervention	3 groups of four children benefitted from 30 small group maths intervention sessions. The results were outstanding in terms of progress made but also in confidence and attitudes towards maths.
Clicker 6 software was purchased across the school	This has enable reluctant and vulnerable writers to have increased opportunities for writing.
Phonics resources	Additional phonics resources wee purchased for small group interventions focussing on this children needing additional support to pass the Y1 Phonics test and Y2 phonics re-check.
Assessment materials	Assessment materials to help identify barriers to learning have enabled us to identify ways of supporting children and removing barriers to learning such as using overlays and becoming dyslexia friendly across the school.
Assessment and tracking data training	Teachers participated in training in our Target Tracker software. This has helped teachers to use the software to identify children who are not making sufficient or expected progress and identify areas of weakness or strength. Groups can be selected to measure the progress of interventions.
Reading books for reluctant and vulnerable learners	High interest but simplified text books have enabled our most reluctant readers to engage in reading and take an interest in stories and books.
Cooking resources	A small group of children have had regular cooking lessons to develop independent earning skills and prepare them with purposeful contexts for reading and writing.
