



Pupil Premium Funding - Information for Parents

Impact of funding 2014-2015

Pupil Premium Funding is an extra grant that schools receive for each child who is in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM), who is Looked After (LAC) or if they have ever claimed Free School Meals in the previous 6 years (Ever 6). The grant received for these children is £1300 per pupil 2014/15.

Pupil Premium will also be paid at a level of £300 per pupil if their parents are in the Services.

37 out of 209 children receive the Pupil Premium (17%)

In 2014-2015 the school received a Pupil Premium budget of £52,000.

Impact:

Year 6

The attainment for those children receiving pupil premium improved significantly and was comparable to national figures for all children.

The impact of this funding was that Y6 children made excellent progress during the year and good progress overall.

Reading 4.4 points progress in a year. Whilst 92% of children made expected progress from KS1, which is broadly in line with the national average for all children (91%)

Writing 4.6 points progress during the year. With 92% of children making expected progress from KS1, which is slightly below the national average for all children (94%)

Maths 6.0 points progress during the year. Impressively, 100% of children made expected progress from KS1, which is higher than the national average for all children (90%)

Whole school impact

Reading progress 3.3 points. This is broadly average progress.

Writing progress 3.1 points. This is broadly average progress.

Maths progress 3.9 points. This is above average progress

Children receiving additional support through pupil premium funding made the same or more progress on average than other children.

The Pupil Premium Funding was spent in the following ways:
