RECEPTION: What a fantastic week we have had. The children have settled well and we are coping well with the full days. We really enjoyed our Humpty Dumpty week and our egg drop investigation was lots of fun. The children sat really well for the Magic Carpet show on Thursday and all thoroughly enjoyed it. We have enjoyed wearing our own clothes on Friday and finding out about CAFOD. We also enjoyed finding out who our buddies are and spending some time with them. Next week we will be using the nursery rhyme 'Baa Baa Black Sheep' for our focus. Have a lovely weekend!

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YEAR 3: Well we have had another busy week in Year 3. We have been learning our 3 times tables and practising the associated division facts. For homework, children have a set of timetables cards to help them learn their 3 times tables. They need to know these off by heart and in any random order. Next week we will also be learning the 4 times tables so it is important that children try their hardest with these. In Literacy we have started to learn about the features of instruction writing and children have been thinking about writing instructions of 'How to clean their teeth'. Next week we will be putting our learning into action as children write their own set of instructions. We also enjoyed a great walk to Hodbarrow on Wednesday – the weather was beautiful and the children did well remembering some of the things we had learned over the past two weeks. We all enjoyed the Magic Carpet show, thank you to those of you who contributed towards the cost and we finished off the week with our CAFOD Harvest Fast Day! Hope you all have a lovely weekend!

YEAR 4: This week the children have worked hard to develop their understanding of Roman Numerals in Maths and have written their final letters in our unit of work on letter writing. In the coming week, we will be beginning some work on addition; in particular using the column method to add numbers with up to 4 digits. In English, we will be beginning a unit of work on story writing starting with the rags to riches tale of 'Lazy Jack.' Our topic work will lead us to think about ways in which people tried to stay safe during the Blitz especially going to shelters and the blackout. In RE, we will be thinking about Moses and his call from God. Can I please ask you all to check that your child has pumps in school and that they have their school PE kits on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.
