- Each child to be listened to and treated fairly.
- Contact from us when your child hasn't behaved in an acceptable way or who continually chooses not to show respect.
- Prompt action to any problem you tell us about.
- Support and assistance from staff when needed.

At Woodseats School we believe in a positive behaviour ethos in which each child is treated fairly and which encourages children to take responsibility for their actions.

This leaflet helps to explain this policy to you. Please ask us for more information.

RESPECT	<p>At Woodseats our core value is RESPECT.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Respect for ourselves: each child is expected give their best • Respect for each other: each child is expected to treat all peers and adults with respect • Respect for the school environment: each child is expected to take care of all school property <p>Each class, at the beginning of the academic year will work together to draw up a classroom charter based on our Rules. The children will all sign up to working together to support each other to keep their own rules. The Rules and Class Charter are reinforced and revisited throughout the year.</p>
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<p>At Woodseats we value:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The right to feel safe and be safe in our body and feelings • The right to learn to the best of our ability • The right to be respected and treated with dignity at all times • The right to an environment of justice and a sense of fairness • Time to reflect, listen and learn together after incidents, sharing feelings in regard to how incidents are managed • The right to make reparation • Equality of opportunity and accessibility for everyone <p>Our aim is to work together with parents and carers so that every child feels happy and safe and enjoys their time at our school. The school will involve outside agencies whenever necessary to support you and your child.</p> <p>We want our children to leave Woodseats School with self-confidence and self-worth, understanding the importance of contributing positively to the community they are part of.</p>
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<p>Woodseats rules are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ We show respect and good manners at all times ➤ Follow instructions with thought and care ➤ Care for everyone and everything 	Woodseats Golden Rules
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Consequences	<p>When a consequence needs to be put in place this will be discussed with the child and should where possible relate to whatever action. For example a lack of respect in the football court may lead to the child not being allowed to play football for an agreed amount of time. If the child's behaviour does not improve this will lead to a loss of some of their golden time.</p> <p>If a child needs further support the school will invite parents to work with the school in drawing up an Individual Behaviour Plan where a consistency of behaviour and consequences are agreed for home and school.</p> <p>On rare occasions the school may ask a child to work in another room or have a fixed term exclusion.</p>
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<p>All teachers use praise to encourage the children. As a school we strongly believe in using encourage and develop children's self-esteem and confidence.</p> <p>Children will be given the opportunity to take part in Golden Time every Friday to reinforce the importance of following the Rules.</p> <p>Alongside this positive notes home are given to individual children for a range of things</p> <p>Also each class has a marble jar reward. Children will earn marbles when they are seen following the rules. They will receive a class reward when the jar has 150 marbles.</p> <p>During break times children who are seen following the rules will be given a green ticket. Again these are collected in the classroom and when they have 50 the class receive and extra playtime .</p>	Positive notes home Golden Time
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
