

Salterlee - Pupil Premium 2014/2015

Since September 2012 all schools have been required to publish information on their Pupil Premium funding. The Department of Education issue the Pupil Premium allocation to schools based on 'Ever 6' as of the most recent census. This funding is available for us to support children in care, adopted children, children of parents serving in the armed forces and children known to be eligible for free school meals over a 6 year period.

For the period 1st September 2014 to 31st August 2015 Salterlee Primary School received Pupil Premium funding of £5644.40.

Our Pupil Premium initiatives have included:

- Training and salary costs towards the creation of Learning Mentor post with a focus on attendance and behaviour support
- Targeted support from Teaching Assistants to support curriculum access
- Funding of trips, visits and visitors to school in promotion of inspirational events and experiences, including the Year 5/6 and Year 3/4 residentials
- Purchase of resources to support intervention
- Participation in a Brass Band Ensemble

In the last academic year (September 2014 to August 2015) Salterlee Primary School used its Pupil Premium funding to provide both individual and group intervention to ensure continued progress and academic achievement. This has focussed on literacy and numeracy Precision Teaching.

Pupil Premium monitoring of impact continues with additional targeted focus on aspirational events, visitors and provision. Pupil premium children have the option for educational visits being

funded, additional resources being purchased and free attendance at breakfast and after school club.

Impact Summary

In 2014/15 Salterlee had two Year 6 pupils eligible for the Pupil Premium, their progress between Key Stages 1 and 2 was as follows:

In year school data for 2014/15 shows that the average progress made throughout the year by Salterlee's seven eligible pupils was as follows:

Maths	7	4.0
Reading	7	4.0
Writing	7	4.3

This indicates that all were on track to make at least expected progress.

Next Steps

During the current academic year (September 2015 to August 2016) the school is estimated to receive £5,000 and will continue to use the Pupil Premium grant to support individual and group intervention work.

In particular we will further develop the role of our Learning Mentor to ensure that we accurately target support at the individual learning needs of all our eligible pupils. This support will include regular mentoring for all eligible pupils encouraging them to reflect on their learning.
