Nature of support Autumn 2015 and Spring 2016

- Additional TA support delivering interventions to children in FS for 3.5 hours a week
- Additional TA support delivering interventions to children in class1 for 8.5 hours a week.
- Additional TA support delivering interventions to children in class 2 for 7.75 hours a week and teacher time for 3 hours per week
- Additional TA support delivering intervention to children in class 3 for 5 hours a week and teacher time of an hour per week.
- 50% payment towards residential for Year 5 and 6 PPG children (Total £680)

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2015/16

- All TAs are delivering carefully targeted interventions to PPG children.
- Current interventions for Y5/6 Booster maths - specific gaps, reading and comprehension support
- Current interventions for Y3/4 are emotional literacy, reading group, challenge maths, acceler read/write, Toe by Toe and 5 min box.
- Current Interventions for Y1/2 are Acceler read/write, 5 min box, speech and language, number recognition, fun fit
- Developing social and emotional skills in vulnerable pupils.
- Accessing Think children to support emotional development.

These are all in addition to other interventions delivered within the class by both the teacher and TA. They are funded through PPG.

Pupil Premium is further used in foundation Stage to ensure that children have either 1:1 or small group work to secure their first steps.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

- Each term we analyse the progress made by all children including the Pupil Premium children as a group.
- At the end of 2014 pupils eligible for PPG funding had made progress at least equal to that of other pupils. Pupil Premium children make good progress in maths, reading and writing in all year groups. By the end of KS2 in July 2015 there were no gaps in learning between PP children and non- PP children.
- Interventions are targeted carefully to match the needs of PPG based on data analysis and consultation with teachers and parents.
