

## Foreign Languages in the New Curriculum 2014

*The 2014 National Curriculum sets out the statutory requirements for teaching foreign languages in the Primary School at KS2 level.*

*There is yet no requirement for Primary Schools to teach foreign languages at KS1.*

### Purpose:

- Learning a foreign language provides the children with a opening to other cultures.
- A high quality education fosters children's curiosity and deepens their understanding of the world.
- It provides children with the means to respond to others in both spoken and written forms.
- It opens up windows of opportunities for travel and employment.
- It allows for new ways of thinking.
- It enables great literature to be enjoyed in its original form.
- It offers the foundations for learning further languages.

### Aims:

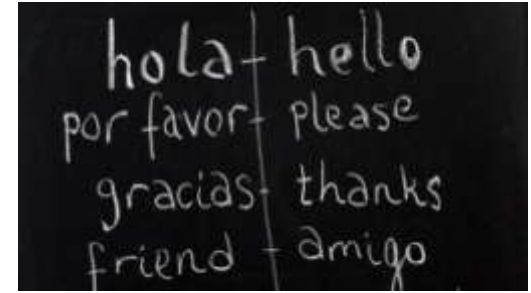
- Speak with increasing confidence and fluency.
- To join in discussion and ask appropriate questions.
- Improve accuracy and intonation.
- Write at varying lengths for different purposes and audiences.

## Spanish at WPS

To help our children develop the greatest understanding of Spanish we have two specialist Spanish teachers.

### KS1

- At WPS we start teaching the children Spanish from an early age in Year 1.
- The children in this year begin an introduction to Spanish learning the basic skills. This includes learning the colours, days of the week and how to express emotions.
- They are taught how to listen attentively to the spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding.
- They learn how to explore the patterns and sounds of the language through songs and rhymes.
- They are encouraged to engage within conversation.
- This prepares the children for entering the KS2 curriculum in year 3.



### KS2

- In KS2 the children build on their understanding already gained from KS1 to consolidate knowledge.
- They learn through a range of approaches including songs, reading and writing.
- They are taught to speak in full sentences using familiar vocabulary.
- They develop the need for accurate pronunciation and intonation.
- They are taught how to read carefully and show an understanding of words and phrases.
- They learn how to write phrases from memory.
- To develop an appreciation of songs, stories and rhymes.
