Disadvantaged Pupils – 17.9 Reading-18.6 Writing-18.1 Mathematics 17.0

Other Pupils – 17.5 Reading-17.8 Writing-17.2 Mathematics 17.6

Disadvantaged pupils average point score was higher than other pupils with the exception of mathematics, where there was a marginal difference.
