Mission Statement

Learning Through Faith

Learning develops independent thinking children,

Aims:

- For staff, pupils and other stakeholders to know how to be safe on the internet.
- For children and adults to recognise potential risks using technology and what to do about them.
- All staff and parents to know and understand safe-guarding procedures related to E-Safety.

Organisation:

EYFS & KS1 pupils learn about E-Safety through Hector's World and Kim & Lee's adventures and other resources appropriate for the children's age.

At KS2 pupils are taught through Cyber Café - Think U Know resources and other age related resources.

These are discretely taught annually but may also be touched upon and incorporated through PSHE, Computing and RE learning sessions.

E Safety Assemblies to pupils and information evenings to parents are delivered by the DSP and Computing Coordinator annually.

Time allocation:

A discrete unit to be taught annually to each year group.

H&S:

All staff and pupils will behave in a responsible manner when using the internet, digital and mobile technologies. These expectations are applicable to any voluntary, statutory and community organisations that makes use of the school's ICT facilities and digital technologies.

Assessment:

Children will be surveyed annually to monitor their values and responses to being safe. Online external surveys national (Think U Know) and local/county questionnaires to compare school on school data.
