Key actions arising:

- Introduction of 'Cornerstones' Curriculum - many opportunities for interesting learning activities (to address qn 5 - 10.5% and 0.5%)
- See Ofsted Action Plan (to address qn 7- 11% and 0.5%)
- Children being given further opportunities for pupil independence and responsibility (to address qn 15 - 13.6% and 2%) e.g. new House system, House Captains, Y5 and Y6 children leading lunchtime clubs, pupil led learning opportunities in new 'Cornerstones' curriculum
- New gates and fencing to address qn 17 (11.5% and 1.5%)
- New House system to be introduced to reward positive behaviour, being a good friend, academic achievement (qn 18 - 14% and 1% and qn 9)
- Introduction of new 'Cornerstones' curriculum to give opportunities for pupil led learning (qn 20 - 11% and 1.5%)
