

PE and Sports Premium Grant (SPG) expenditure report: 2013/14

Nature of spending 2013/14

This money has been used to improve the quality of PE and sport activities which we offer to our pupils. It has paid for sessions from professional sports coaches, a session from a paralympian and equipment to improve the quality and further increase the range of sports covered within school and coaches (shared between cluster schools) in order to allow children to take part in competitive sporting opportunities with their peers from other schools.

Curriculum focus of PE and SPG spending 2013/14

Our focus this year was to address points for improvement raised by pupils and parents at the start of the year. We have worked hard to provide competitive opportunities, helping with their team work and further strengthening their understanding of the way we can learn from others. Improved learning experiences were facilitated through the use of newly purchased PE apparatus and gymnastics equipment. The children were inspired and motivated by a visit from a paralympian and professional coaches for tennis, cricket and rugby from the Worcester Warriors.

Measuring the impact of SPG spending

At the end of the year pupils told us that having professional sports people in school to share with them and teach them had been exciting and shown them what can be achieved through dedication and commitment. They were encouraged to think not just about sport but also about healthy lifestyles and keeping fit. The children also told us that they were enjoying PE and sports more and we have noticed how eager they are to be part of a team. They are learning to work together and support their team members with noticeable success.

Staff have benefitted from the information shared at a cluster gymnastics training session and feedback indicates that the new gymnastics equipment and training has allowed them to improve their

PE teaching skills, directly impacting on the children.

All year groups have had competitive opportunities within both the school setting and within our cluster of schools. Their sportsmanship and team spirit has grown and we have achieved well as a school in sporting events.

Nature of planned spending 2014/15

This money will be used to fund a new sports court with all weather surface to improve the quality of sporting opportunities and also the variety of sports that we are able to offer due to present limited facilities. Our new court will enable sports to take place throughout the year so extending the sporting facilities currently restricted to the summer months meaning healthier, happier children.

Curriculum focus of PE and sports spending 2014/15

This year's focus is to further extend competitive sporting opportunities across the school giving all of our pupils from Reception to Year 5 an opportunity to experience competition. Alongside this we will also be developing independence and leadership skills within our KS2 children using them as team leaders and motivators within sporting events. These children will develop their ability to take responsibility for organising and leading younger children.

Measuring the impact of SPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact of the improved outdoor facilities on the wellbeing and sporting attitudes of our pupils throughout the year. Evaluation will focus on team spirit, and the children's ability to manage disappointment in competitive sporting events. Pupil leadership within KS2 and an understanding of healthy competitiveness across the school is also anticipated. Pupil engagement in sport and the development of good attitudes will be monitored and ultimately recorded by means of a

pupil questionnaire at the end of the year to give opportunity for the pupil voice to be heard and an evaluation of success measured.
