## Nature of support 2013 - 2014

This money has supported families (free school meals and other families in need) with payments for extra-curricular activities. It has been used to purchase extra TA support (both small group and individual) to improve progress and attainment for these children which included both support to overcome barriers to learning and challenge for the more able. Thrive Practitioner training was undertaken by a member of staff with a view to supporting those children and identifying their barriers to learning. We consciously kept KS1 class sizes smaller to address need.

## Curriculum Focus 2013 - 2014

There was a focus on the core subjects of maths and writing for our pupil premium children and also others who benefitted from extra intervention. The focus was on raising self esteem and improving attainment in end of year assessments for identified children. In particular extra emphasis was given to preparing our older children for transition to their next school.

## Measuring the impact of spending 2013 - 2014

Our target group of children made accelerated progress in their learning with two children in writing reaching national expectations following intervention. Another child made 9 points progress in maths and reading and 12 points progress in writing following intervention and support. One child excelled in all subjects having been challenged to be the best that child could be.

## Nature of planned support 2014 - 2015

This money will continue to support families (free school meals and other families in need) with payments for extra-curricular activities. It will be used to purchase extra TA support at Grade 2 (for both small groups and individuals) to improve progress and attainment for some of these children which will include support to overcome barriers to learning. It will also be used to purchase extra equipment to support learning in maths and to purchase the ongoing Thrive practitioner license and refresher training to enable screening of our pupil premium children. We continue to keep class sizes small to address need through quality first teaching.

## Curriculum Focus of PPG spending 2014 - 2015

Supporting children through extra creative curricular opportunities and extra-curricular activities. To continue to improve the rate of progress for some children who are currently within the expected range of attainment in order to close the gap with their peers. To provide CPD for relevant staff to support target children to achieve more. This focus is subject to continuous evaluation and may therefore be subject to change.

## Measuring the impact of PPG spending July 2015

The final evaluation will be reported at the end of this academic year and will be evidenced by attainment data and pupil wellbeing.
