### Sports Premium Overview

At Whiteways Primary School we recognise the importance that physical education, healthy active lifestyles and competitive sports have in helping to prepare pupils for adult life.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement to provide additional funding to improve the provision of physical education and sports in primary schools. We are committed to ensuring that this money provides pupils with greater opportunities to engage in sporting and physical activities as well as ensuring that they receive a wider range of experiences to help them develop a fuller understanding of the world.

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### What does the Sport Premium Funding mean for Whiteways?

*'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this' (DfE June 2013).*

The three key areas for consideration when allocating the funding are; Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sports.

We have decided to allocate the Sport Premium Grant on the following:

<b>Physical Education</b> <b>Raising standards of all our children in Physical Education</b>
Specialist P.E. coaches working with teachers and children to develop the teaching of P.E.

<b>Healthy Active Lifestyles</b> <b>Ensuring all our children have access to regular exercise</b> <b>Ensuring all our children have access to outdoor and adventurous activities</b>
Enhance the range of sporting after school activities.
Improve the physical wellbeing of all our children.
Promote walking to school with our Walk to School and Early Bird challenges.
Bike ability to increase the number of children who are able to safely ride their bikes.
Develop Forest Schools opportunities for all year groups.
Develop outdoor adventurous activities such as the use of Thornbridge Outdoor Centre.
This year we are funding swimming lessons for our 90 Year 3 children. To build on this Governors have agreed to allocate additional funding for further year groups.

**Competitive School Sport**  
**Increasing pupils' participation in competitive sport**

Increase competitive sports such as our football team as well as working with Sheffield United.

Give opportunities for our children to participate on locality competitions e.g. basketball and handball.

Access multi-sport events with other local primaries and the secondary school.
