

# The Use and Impact of the School Sports Premium

## Linden Primary School – 2014/2015

### **Background**

The Government has provided additional funding of £150 million per academic years for 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 with £8000 + £5 per pupil to enable us to build a legacy of high quality PE and Sports. This is to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding in order to improve the current provision of PE and sport across primary schools.

This document will identify and share how Linden has spent or will spend the funding. Ofsted has strengthened the coverage of Physical Education and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how Physical Education and sport will be addressed in future as part of the school's overall provision. This funding must be spent on improving the provision of Physical Education and sport for the benefit of all children so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

### **Our Linden Philosophy**

PE and Sport play a very important part in the life of Linden Primary School; two, hour sessions per week, are dedicated to physical activity in the curriculum. We believe that physical education and sport contribute to the holistic development of all children and through participation in sport and physical education, children learn more about key values of teamwork, fair play and respect for themselves and others. Children can develop competence to excel in a broad range of physical activities.

There is significant evidence to show the positive effects of sport and exercise on children's physical health, growth and development. Furthermore, sport also provides a healthy environment for children to learn how to deal with competition and the effects of leading a healthy and active life.

### **Linden's use of the Sport Premium - £9001**

- We have continued our school sports partnership with Crown Hills Community College. This has enabled our Key Stage 1 & 2 children the full use of high quality facilities as well as participation in several sports festivals, competitions and sporting events throughout the year. Cost £3000

- We have provided release for all teachers to work alongside our school based sport staff for professional development in PE and sport. Cost £850
- We have bought in specialist sports coaches to complement our Linden sport staff to provide further professional development for teachers. Cost £50
- We have used the funding to support regular sport tournaments, festivals and competitions for pupils of all ages. Cost £25 Leicester FA league – £20 badminton tournament - Cost £300 – Inter football league.
- We have engaged an external coach to operate a weekly lunch time skipping club. Cost £1440
- We are consistently replenishing our school sports equipment and resources to enable maximum participation across the school. Cost £1172.04

Total Spend - £6857.04

## **Impact at Linden**

- Use our PE specialist teacher to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE.
- Establishing, sustainable partnerships with local community sports clubs.
- Varied After-School sports clubs for all age groups.
- Taking part in competitive sport against other local schools- multi-sport, football and cricket.
- Vastly increased participation in inter school competitions for all ages.
- Improved behaviour due to lunchtime activities provided by our in school sports coach and skipping club.
- Children's social, cultural, moral and spiritual understanding through taking part in physical activity.
- Children's social, cultural, moral and spiritual understanding through taking part and meeting children from other backgrounds.
