**Reception:** Thank you for coming to parents evening we have enjoyed chatting with you all. On Wednesday we enjoyed using our senses to explore the gingerbread man it was lots of fun especially when we got to eat them. Next week we are going to start looking at The Magic Porridge Pot. In maths we are going to look at weight and capacity. Have a look at the Tapestry and feel free to upload anything the children do at home. Have a lovely weekend.

**Year 1** The children have had an exciting week in school, we discovered that Goldilocks had run away after destroying the bears' house and that the police were after her. Next week, we will be recording this story as a newspaper report. In Maths, we will be carrying on with subtracting larger numbers. The children have been coping really well with the new strategies we have been learning. In RE we will be beginning to look at the events that led up to the Easter story and how this affects us today. It was lovely to see you all again at parent's evening, and sharing your child's progress with you. Have a lovely weekend!

**Year 2:** We have had a great week writing lots of our own build ups to the Jack and then Beanstalk story. Next week we are going to continue with this and have a try writing new complete stories. In maths we have completed our money work and have moved on to fractions. We are looking at features of Castles and are designing our own to build. In RE we are looking at Cafod linked to 'give drink to the thirsty.' This is part of our Year of Mercy work. It was nice to meet everyone at parents evening and thank you for your support. I have sent home some examples of the maths as I discussed, these are not to return but are to help you practice at home. Thank you and have a great weekend.

**Year 3:** Year 3 have had a good week and have completed some assessments in Maths before starting a new unit on fractions – we have been looking at tenths this week and children have made a good start. In writing, we have also started a new unit looking at 'The Nightmare Man' which focuses on being afraid of the dark. It was lovely to see you all at parents evening and discuss your children's work. If you ever have any questions, queries or concerns, please do not hesitate to get in touch. Homework this week is to spend time reading with your child and 30 minutes on Mathematics! Have a nice weekend.

**Year 4:** It was great to speak to you all at Parent's evening to discuss the progress that your child has made. This coming week, we will be exploring decimals further. We will be comparing and ordering decimals and towards the end of the week, we will be thinking about rounding decimals to the nearest whole number. In English, we will be looking at The Saga of Bjorn and retelling the story. In RE, we will be thinking about 'Giving drink to the thirsty' as part of your work on the year of mercy. Have a great weekend!

**Year 5:** It has been a busy week in Year 5! The children have produced some lovely pieces of writing for our unit on non-chronological reports. Next week we will begin writing our own reports. In maths we completed our unit on time and graphs which the children have really enjoyed. We will be moving on to shape and angles next week. On Monday it will be our class mass at 9:30am in St. James' church. Please feel welcome to come along and celebrate mass with us; it would be lovely to see you there. I hope you have a great weekend!

**Year 6:** It was lovely to see so many parents at parents evening and talk about your child's progress with you. I can always be contacted through school if you have concerns or queries. This week we have been learning about how to calculate a percentage of an amount in maths and in Literacy, the children have been thinking about sentence structure and vocabulary choices in preparation for writing a story next week. Alongside this work, we have been looking at past papers in arithmetic and SP&G in preparation for SATs in May. Unfortunately, the children weren't able to swim on Wednesday: when we arrived, there was no lifeguard available. Things should be back to normal next week. Next week, the police will visit the children to present a workshop about identity and prejudice. On Friday, 10 children will be representing the school in a tag rugby tournament. Have a great weekend.

**WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING:** Year 4 went over to Mass on Monday, thank you to those parents and parishioners who joined us. Unfortunately our swimming lessons were cancelled again this week due to there being no lifeguard available at the swimming pool. We were unaware of the problem until we actually got to the pool!

**WEEK COMMENCING 14<sup>th</sup> MARCH:** Year 5 will be attending Mass at 9.30am on Monday, as always you are very welcome to come and join us. Cumbria Police will be coming in to school to work with year 5 and year 6 children on Monday, the sessions will be about prejudice and identity. We are sure the children will enjoy the sessions that are planned. The first group of parents for the Reception Stay & Play session will be on Thursday afternoon. On Friday, Miss Fry will be taking our Rugby team to the Tag Rugby Festival which is being held at St Bees. Children who are in the team have been informed. We wish them all good luck and hope they enjoy the experience. Tennis is cancelled on Tuesday this week but it will be on as usual on 22<sup>nd</sup> March.

**IMPORTANT E-SAFETY:** We have arranged for Jeff Haslam to come into school on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> March to work with the children on the subject of E-Safety. He will also hold a parents meeting at 6pm that evening to give safeguarding advice to parents. We have had several instances of children coming into school having accessed unsuitable material at home without their parent's knowledge, this has caused upset and distress to the children, staff and parents. It is very important that parents do understand how they can prevent children from viewing sites that are unsuitable for children and Jeff will give you all the help and advice you need to help. The meeting won't be a long one but it will be full of very useful information and advice. Jeff will also answer any questions you may have about e-safety. We have run these sessions in the past but despite the importance of the subject and the effect it can have on children, we have not had a very good turnout. There are many, many new sites including social media sites that children do regularly access and these are full of hidden dangers that you should be aware of. I would urge you to please do come along to this meeting as I'm sure it will help you to safeguard your children. Thank you. On 22<sup>nd</sup> March, our parents guild will be having their meeting after the e-safety meeting at about 6.30pm, please do come or stay on after the e-safety if you possibly can. On Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> March we welcome the second group of parents for the stay and play in Reception class. There will be a Songs from the Shows Flower Demonstration in our school hall at 7pm. This is in aid of Our Lady & St James' RC Church Restoration Fund. Everyone welcome, tickets can be purchased from school and are priced at £5.

#### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

**GIRLS UNIFORM:** Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights.

**BOYS UNIFORM:** Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.

**LABELS:** All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

#### **PE KITS**

**All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.**

**PE KIT:** White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps (not trainers).

If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.

**EARRINGS:** Please remove your child's earrings on their PE days. And also on Swimming days. They will not be allowed to take part in PE lessons if they are wearing their earrings. Thank you.

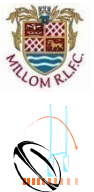
