Sports Premium Statement 2014-2015

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school Headteachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

The funding allocation for Our Lady of Perpetual Help Primary school, for 2014-2015 is £8540
