Welcome back to the Summer Term.

Step into my World is the starting theme for some exciting learning planned across the schools. This term we are focusing on deepening children's skills and understanding particularly in maths and literacy. We are encouraging children to take pride in their work so handwriting and presentation will continue to be a focus. We are continuing to teach the learning powers of curiosity, responsibility, resilience, thinking and learning to enable children to become life long learners. We are also continuing to develop our understanding of the 'growth mindset' so that we all have a positive 'I can do this' attitude'.

Please continue to support your children by reading together regularly, participating in the reading challenge, practising spellings and playing word games, counting and playing games with numbers and calculation. For further ideas please speak to your child's teacher.

This is also an important term as we will be making summary assessments which will be reported to you by the end of term. These reports will inform you whether your child is working at the expected level compared to other children nationally, whether your child has made expected or better progress, and also report to you any statutory tests that your child has completed in Y1, Y2 and Y6. Please watch out for an information booklet about assessments from the DFE which we will email out to you and which will be on the website.

Remember every day your child attends school makes a difference so please avoid all unnecessary absence. Well done to Fireflies Class who had the best attendance last term. I wonder which class will be top this term? Thank you for your continuing support.

News from Fireflies

We hope that you had an enjoyable and restful Easter holidays. We would like to welcome Miss Ferguson and Louise to Fireflies within the Summer Term.

Within English, we have begun looking at Traditional tales. We will be studying the traditional tale of Cinderella and other versions of the story such as The Grimms Brothers version. We will be practising our speech skills – using a range of punctuation to punctuate direct speech. We will be focusing on the correct use of commas as well as including fronted adverbials and a range of conjunctions within our writing.

Within Maths, we have completed our sequence of converting measures and will now be moving on to Geometric reasoning. We will be focussing on the translation, rotation and reflection of shapes.

Within our Topic work, we have begun looking at different types of shoes and will begin to make predictions and conduct investigations based around the materials these shoes are made from.

Within computing, we have begun to look at the steps that search engines and technology make in order to provide us with information. Over the next week, we will be looking, using search technology and digit content, to follow in the steps of Shackleton and his journey.

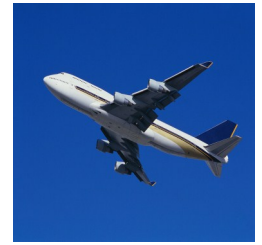
