Reception: A lovely week in reception this week. It was very exciting coming in on Tuesday to find the classroom full of giant footsteps. We have enjoyed learning the Jack and the Beanstalk story. We will continue with this next week. In maths we have looked at doubling. We enjoyed making double butterflies and learning to solve big doubles. Next week we will be looking at number, ordering numbers, finding one more one less. In RE we are looking at the story of Jesus and the fishermen. Have a lovely weekend.

Year 1: The children have been having great fun in maths this week, looking at capacity and how full a container is. Next week we will be looking at mass and how heavy or light objects are. In RE we will be looking at stories about Jesus after Easter; the children are really enjoying listening to new stories from the bible. Our main focus for topic next week is 'Our Bodies' as the Life Bus is coming to school. As mentioned on the newsletter last week, the Life Bus visit now needs donations from each child, so could we ask that each child tries to bring in £2 to pay for this cost. Thank you! Have a lovely weekend!

Year 2: We are looking at different instructions next week to create toolkits for our writing. This is being done in a creative way using the children's ideas. We are also looking at different sentences and revising spelling patterns. Our Science topic this term is about plants and growing we are hoping to try growing some different plants during this work.

In RE we are completing our Year of Mercy work 'giving drink to the thirsty.'

Next week we have a visit from the life education bus which the children always enjoy. This now needs a donation of £2 for each child to pay for the costs please.

Year 3: Year 3 have had a good week this week! Firstly, well done to the four girls who helped Year 4 in the Hockey tournament at Millom School on Tuesday. We were very proud of you all. In class we have been continuing work on fractions, finding equivalent fractions and comparing fractions using the greater and less than symbols. Homework reflects this. In Literacy, we have started writing our own version of 'Rainbow Bird'. We have been having a really big push on writing in complete sentences again and if your children do any writing at home, it would be great if you can encourage this. Children have been thinking about using adjectives and starting their sentences in different ways. Next week, on Monday we have a visit from the Life Education Bus. A donation of £2 towards this has been requested. Also on Wednesday, Charlie Lupton will be in school building a Viking Longship with us! There will therefore be no swimming on Wednesday for Year 3. Many Thanks.

Year 4: We have had a really good week in school this week; the children have been working hard in all lessons. This coming week, our focus in Maths will shift towards shape and space. In particular, we will be looking at coordinates and plotting points on a grid. Towards the end of the week, we will be thinking about translations and how we can describe movements on a grid. In Literacy, we will continue with the story of 'The Balaclava Boys.' We will be looking closely at the text and thinking about how we can create tension and excitement within stories. As the date of our residential trip fast approaches, I will be holding two sessions where I will be available for you to come and talk to me regarding any queries or concerns that you may have about the trip. These will be held on Tuesday and Thursday next week. I will be available in my classroom from 3.15 until 4pm on both of these evenings. I hope to see some of you there.

Year 5: We have had another busy week in Year 5! The children have been measuring angles on a straight line and around a point along with drawing angles in maths. They have managed really well with these tasks and next week we will be going on to explore rectangles. In literacy, the children have been looking at rhythm and rhyme in poetry. They also finished off the week by performing part one of *The Highwayman*; everyone did a fantastic job! Thank you to everyone who came along to support us with our bag pack at Tesco. We managed to raise £305 to go towards our residential trip to Lockerbie. We will let you know in due course how much the final cost for Lockerbie is with the fund raising amounts taken off. I hope you have a lovely weekend!

Year 6: It's been another busy week in year 6! In literacy, we have been reading texts with a similar theme and recognising the way in which the reader can infer information from the information given. We have also been checking up on the vocabulary that the children will need to know for their SATs in May. In maths, we have been learning about how to find the area of a triangle. Next week, we will be learning how to calculate the volume of a cube and cuboid. In RE, the children have been learning about The Passover with Mrs Marmion. It has been brought to my attention that a number of the children are becoming stressed about the SATs. Sadly, as a school, we have no control over the curriculum or the tests; they are statutory and the content must be taught in all

state maintained schools. This year, the tests have been revised to reflect the new content and as a result, they are much harder than they have been previously. We have no idea what the expected standard is, nor will we know until after the children have sat the papers. All we ask is for the children to do their best. If you are concerned about your child, please come and talk to us; if there is anything we can put in place to help them, we will. At home, you can help your child by reading with them regularly, practising tables and making sure they get plenty of rest.

WEEK COMMENCING 25TH APRIL: The Life Education Bus will be with us on Monday 25th & Tuesday 26th April. Years 3, 6 and 4 will have a lesson in the bus on Monday and years 1, 5, 2 and Reception will have theirs on Tuesday. There is a session for parents on Monday from 2.45pm – 3.15pm if you would like to come. The bus will be in the forecourt at the main Lonsdale Road entrance. The cost of the bus visit has increased over the years and we will no longer receive any funding donation towards it as in previous years. The donation was given by Diane Tyson and her team who fund raised for many years to help schools benefit from the bus. Unfortunately this group has disbanded and we need to pay for it ourselves. Could we please ask for a donation of £2 per child which will greatly help towards the cost of the visit. Year 6 will be going over to Mass in Church on Tuesday. Mass is now at the earlier time of 9.00am and we would ask that children please be in school promptly, ready to go over at 8.55am. Year 3 will have an exciting day on Wednesday when Charlie Lupton brings his Viking Longship workshop to school. Parents of year 3 children are invited to come into the hall at the end of the day to see what the children have built during the day. On Thursday our Parents Guild will be holding their Summer Term Disco. As always KS1 will be from 5.30pm – 6.30pm and KS2 from 7pm – 8.15pm. Admission is £1, a tuck shop and hot dogs will be available. Glo Bands will be on sale throughout the evening. Please could we ask that children **DO NOT** bring mobile phones to the disco.

School will be closed on Thursday 5th May as our building is being used as a Polling Station for the elections.

Year 4 Residential Trip: Just a reminder to Year 4 parents – final payment for the residential trip to Ilkley is due on Friday 6th May, please could ALL outstanding balances be paid by this date. The cost of the trip is £120, if your child is in receipt of or has ever been in receipt of free school meals, please contact our school office if you are unsure of the cost to you. If anyone is unsure of the amount still owing, please contact our school office. Thank you.

Year 5 Residential Trip: We have finalised the cost of our Year 5 residential trip now our fund raising efforts have been completed. The cost of the trip is £215 which means that most people only owe £15. There are some parents who have paid more than this amount and we will be sending refund cheques home to you early next week. We will send out letters to parents on Monday regarding the trip but would ask that the **trip be paid for in full by Friday 29th April.** Thank you.

IMPORTANT: Please can we ask you to check your children's heads thoroughly. We have had some instances of head lice in school so please do be vigilant. Lotion is no longer available from the Children's Centre. We have been advised to direct people to the Community Pharmacy Minor Ailment Scheme which is at either of the Chemists in Millom.
