Suggestions:	How as a school are we going to address this?
After school clubs <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- More variety</li> <li>- More clubs available for KS1</li> </ul>	This term gardening and Art club is starting for KS2 pupils and film club is now open to pupils in Year 2. Mini marathon training will take place this term for those entering the event at the end of the month. We offer a wide number of clubs to pupils in KS2, next academic year we will be reviewing the range of clubs available to children and will be increasing the number of clubs offered to KS1.
More lunch options available / what is nutritional value?	We meet with the kitchen on a termly basis so will raise the number of options available with them at our next meeting. This term we have organised for 'themed lunches' around the continents of the world. These will be available to all pupils (and staff!). We are also organising a lunch for parents in the summer term. More trips to theatres/plays/pantomimes	The school is visited by 'Image Theatre' every January for a whole school pantomime, this is free to parents. Depending on topics, trips are also organised to musicals/plays – our KS2 classes have recently enjoyed a visit to Chitty Chitty Bang Bang! This year we have made a link with Salisbury Playhouse and recently had their BTEC students in to deliver a play to both Key Stages, this is a link we are keen to develop in the future.
Teach children about road safety	Wiltshire Council run road safety sessions to Year 1, 3 and 6 on an annual basis. Bike ability courses are available to Year 5 and 6 pupils twice a year. A scooter skills workshop is offered to Y1-6 pupils on a two yearly basis. Through PSHE and assemblies, road safety is explored with pupils. Year 6 pupils attend Junior Good Citizen each year and this covers elements of staying safe when out and about.
More opportunities to receive updates on child's progress and information to support pupils at home	We have reviewed our end of year report format so it now outlines 'next steps targets' for English and Maths. We are currently updating our website to include information about how you can support your child/children at home in English and Maths. In July we are organising a maths festival for parents and children to learn more about our calculation methods. Keep an eye out on the newsletter for more information/announcements.
