Sports Premium Funding
2015-16

The Sports Premium Funding has been awarded to all schools in order to fund improvements to the provision and lasting impact of PE and sport. This is to encourage pupils to develop healthy lifestyles and to raise the profile, quality and quantity of sport provision in school.

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 and 2015/2016 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

The table below indicates how the money has and will be utilised and the impact the funding will have on promoting healthy lifestyles and improving participation in sport.

How will we be spending the Sport Funding and who will benefit?

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that the most able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments; that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development; that we increase the number of children participating in sport in our school. At Herbert Strutt Primary School we have developed an action plan in order to continue to provide sustained improvement in PE provision, increase levels of involvement in sporting activities and raise achievement for all pupils in PE.

We believe that an outstanding PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of the children and we are committed to ensure that all

pupils receive at least 2 hours of high quality well-planned PE per week delivered by confident and well trained teachers.

The school engages with numerous organisations that support the provision of school sport and the school reaches out to local clubs. We also maintain relationships formed through the SSP to enable access to quality coaches/sports groups which the school can employ to provide Extra Curricular activities. The PE Coordinator is also part of a steering group supporting the School Sport Partnership giving the school access to a network of other schools keen to engage and compete in sport.

We encourage all children to take up the opportunities available to them in the form of clubs, break-time activities and house competitions. In addition, talented children are signposted to local clubs and events to encourage them to develop their skills. They also take part in annual programmes organised by the SSP. All teams receive recognition for their participation and sporting success in the weekly assemblies.
