Reception: We have had a really busy week again in Reception. We really enjoyed our time on the life bus and enjoyed learning all about our body and how to stay healthy. In Literacy we have been changing the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and have produced some creative ideas. Next week we will begin retelling these and recording our new versions on tapestry so please keep your eyes open. In Maths we have been looking at number, ordering numbers and finding one more one less. Next week we will be continuing with number and looking at counting on. In RE we will be looking at what we would say to Jesus if we met him. Please remember to log in to tapestry and upload any videos or photographs of the children completing any activities this weekend. I have sent home a small challenge sheet to try and complete this weekend. Have a lovely long weekend.

Year 1: We have written a fantastic story called, Monkey See, Monkey Do, this week. The children remembered all of their amazing sentence openers, as well as their capital letters and full stops. The children have loved retelling the story out loud, so maybe they could perform it for you at home. In Maths we have been looking at weight and the children did some fantastic predicting. In RE we heard about the story of Doubting Thomas and the children are really enjoying listening to the stories that follow on from Easter. We hope you have a nice long weekend!

Year 2: This week we have written instructions explaining how to capture our imaginary creatures. We have started our new topic about the famous artist Lowry creating questions and then reading facts to find the answers. Next we are going to create reports to share with another class. Lowry has lots of famous paintings which we are going to look at. Following his style we are going to create lots of different art work. Our RE linked to the Year of Mercy is 'visiting the sick' although we are not actually visiting anyone we are praying every day for lots of people we know are not very well at the moment. Have a great weekend.

Year 3: Year 3 has had a great week in school. We have completed our unit on fractions in maths and have started looking at the 8 times tables. Children have brought home 8 times tables cards to learn for their homework. In Literacy we have continued looking at 'Rainbow Bird', changing the story and writing our own versions. We had a great day on Wednesday with Charlie Lupton, building our Viking Longship! Thank you to those who came in to look at the children's work after school. Next week is a short week! Please remember we are not in school Monday and Thursday! Have a lovely extended weekend.

Year 4: We have had another really productive week in school and the children have again worked really hard. In Maths, we have been learning about how to describe positions on a grid using co-ordinates – our homework will reinforce this. This coming week, we will be learning about angles and how to order and name them as acute, obtuse or right angles. In Literacy, we have been continuing to read stories where the characters face a particular issue or dilemma, with a particular focus on writing effective and engaging openings which hook the reader and make them want to continue reading. Please remember that we are not in school on Monday and Thursday this week. Letters have been sent home about the Ilkley trip; **please could you fill in and return the Form C on Tuesday.** Thank you. Have a great weekend!

Year 5: We have had another great week in Year 5. The children really enjoyed their Life Bus session on Tuesday; everyone came away having learnt a great deal. In literacy we have been developing lots of descriptive language for writing poetry. As well as this we have been editing verses from *The Highwayman* so that they are written from a different character's point of view. Next week we will begin to write our own poetry which the children are very excited about. As you will be aware, our residential trip to Lockerbie is fast approaching. If you have any worries or questions about the trip, please do not hesitate to come and see me. I am happy to meet with you any night after school between 3:15pm and 4pm. Letters about the trip have been sent home; **please could you fill in and return the Form C on Tuesday.** I hope you all enjoy the bank holiday weekend!

Year 6: The children have been working really hard this week. In Literacy we have been reading and been learning how to write a letter of complaint and in maths we have learnt how to find the volume of a cube and cuboid. We have also spent time preparing for the SATs, which begin on May 9th. We have continued to look over all the different terms that the children need to be familiar with, ready for their grammar and punctuation paper. Earlier this week, I sent home a reference sheet that the children can use to learn any terms that they are unsure of. I have sent a SP&G paper home for homework this weekend, and the children should use the reference sheet to help them. The children have tackled two maths papers this week and I have also sent these home. The children have been asked to spend time on Athletics practising areas where they are making mistakes. The year 6 children may come into school from 8:30 next week to use the computers for extra practise if they would like to. **Yesterday, Form C for our upcoming trip to London was sent home. I would be grateful if they could be completed and returned on**

Tuesday please. Thank you. Have a great bank holiday weekend!

<p>SCHOOL UNIFORM: Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils;</p> <p>GIRLS UNIFORM: Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn.</p> <p>BOYS UNIFORM: Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.</p> <p>All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.</p> <p>LABELS: All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.</p>	<p>PE KITS: All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.</p> <p>PE KIT: White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps.</p> <p>If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.</p> <p>EARRINGS: Please remove your child's earrings on their PE days. And also on Swimming days. They will not be allowed to take part in PE lessons if they are wearing their earrings. Thank you.</p>

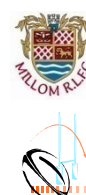
