**Reception:** Well we have had a fun week. The children really enjoyed the BeeBot Workshop on Thursday. They were all very well behaved and gained some new skills on movement and direction. In literacy we have enjoyed looking at instructions on how to make a witches stew the children have enjoyed sequencing the instructions and changing the instructions into new potions. Next week we will be making a fairy potion. In maths as we have been working hard with sharing and everyone appears to have grasped a solid understanding of the process. Next week we will be looking at shape and positional language. One afternoon next we are going to be looking at changes and differences. If possible could you send in a photograph of your child aged 1,2,3,4,5 clearly labelled with their name and what age. We are going to create a personal time line. Thank you have a lovely weekend.

**Year 1:** We have had an excellent week in Year 1! The children have worked so hard on their final stories for the topic, their handwriting is also really improving – so thank you for your support with that at home! In Maths we started looking at adding numbers up to 100. The children have really enjoyed being challenged. Next week we will be finishing our Science Topic about 'People and Animals' as well as looking at more calculating in Maths. When we come back from our half term holiday, the children have one week before the Phonics Screening Test (WB 13th June). As discussed at Parents Evening, all the children will be taking part in this. Please don't tell the children that they will be taking the screening, as they are used to doing these in class! To help your child with the screening, please read with your child, as well looking at the sounds sheet that we will be sending home in the reading bags. The Phonics Play website also has some fantastic resources to support your child too. We hope you have a lovely half term holiday!

**Year 2:** We have had an excellent week in Year 2 this week. We have been completing our work about Katie, Ben and the British Artists and the children have used some amazing ideas in their writing. In maths we have been looking at reflective symmetry and creating our own patterns. Next week we are going to go look at telling the time. Can you please practice this at home as it will really help? Next week we are also completing our topic work about Lowry. The children will have all completed their SATs by the end of May, they have been very sensible and this has been a wonderful experience for them which they have all enjoyed. Have a great weekend and half term.

**Year 3:** Children have enjoyed getting into our new book 'The Tunnel' this week and have been predicting what might have been at the end before we continued the story to find out. We have also been rehearsing the story and drawing story maps in preparation for changing the story next week. In Maths, we have focused of formal methods of division using predominantly our 8 times tables. Children are getting better at these and it really makes a difference when children practice these at home – we can really tell who has been! Children should now know 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables off by heart so please keep up regular practice and games with the children. This week we have also been thinking about Mary in RE, especially leading up to our May procession next week which you are all very welcome to attend. We hope to see you there – remember children can bring small posies of flowers to present to Mary. Have a great weekend.

**Year 4:** Year 4 have been busy this week learning about symmetry in Maths, they have done really well with this and have enjoyed making symmetrical figures using mirrors and by looking carefully at halves of shapes. In Literacy, the children have been writing their own stories based on 'Living on Ice' and they are coming on really nicely. We are having a bit of a refocus on times tables at the moment and it would be really helpful if the children were to have a go at learning these at home over the half term holidays. The focus being on the 6, 7, 8 and 9 times tables. Next week, we will be off on our residential trip to Myddelton Grange in Ilkley. It really is a great trip and I know that the children will have a great time. I will be happy to answer any last minute questions should you have anything that you need to ask. Please do come along to our May Procession on Tuesday if you possibly can. Children are invited to bring in a small bunch of flowers if they wish. Have great weekend and a relaxing half term!

**Year 5:** Year 5 are having a very busy week this week but next week we will be covering letter writing in Literacy and Decimals in Maths. We have had a fantastic time at Lockerbie this week and I am so proud of our Year 5 children. They have tried all of the activities on offer and had lots of fun and, I am happy to say, they have all done their very best and worked as a team every time. All of the children have been very well behaved and are a real credit to their families and their school. Have a fantastic weekend I am sure all of the children will be enjoying a very well deserved rest. We are having our May Procession on Tuesday 24 May 2016 and the children are invited to bring a small bunch of flowers if they wish to.

**Year 6:** It's been a busy week in year 6! With SATs out of the way, we have turned to our topic about Ancient Greece and we have been finding out how historians use surviving artefacts to piece together information about how the

Ancient Greeks lived. We have begun to read 'The Adventures of Odysseus' and we're using this as a stimulus for our writing. On Thursday, we made our own clay pots using coils of clay. In maths, we have been solving problems using bar diagrams. The children have found this challenging, but are beginning to see how such diagrams can help them to see a way of finding a solution. On Wednesday, some of the children represented the school in a netball tournament at Black Combe School; although they didn't win, they all had a great afternoon. Next week, we will continue with our work on the Ancient Greeks and 'The Adventures of Odysseus'. Groups of children will be bag packing at Tesco on Wednesday and Thursday to raise money towards our trip to London. Once this money is counted, we will be able to give you a final total cost for the trip. On Tuesday, please could children bring a small bunch of flowers to lay at the statue of Our Blessed Lady in church. We also desperately need shoe boxes, or boxes of a similar size so that we can make models of homes in Ancient Greece. If you have suitable boxes, I would be grateful if you would send them into school at the beginning of next week. Have a great weekend.

**NO DOGS IN THE PLAYGROUND. THANK YOU:** Can we please ask that you do not bring dogs into the playground when you are picking children up from school or dropping them off. Thank you.

**ILLNESS:** Please remember to ring into school in the morning if your child is absent, stating the nature of their illness. ***Could we also remind you that if your child is absent due to sickness and / or diarrhoea, the recommended time they need to be absent from school is 48 hours from the last episode.*** This is to help reduce the spread of infection. Thank you for your help with this.

**SCHOOL UNIFORM:** Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils;  
**GIRLS UNIFORM:** Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn.  
**BOYS UNIFORM:** Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.  
All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.  
**LABELS:** All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

**PE KITS:** All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.  
**PE KIT:** White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps.  
If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.  
**EARRINGS:** Please remove your child's earrings on their PE days. And also on Swimming days. They will not be allowed to take part in PE lessons if they are wearing their earrings. Thank you.
