Reception: What a lovely first week back; we enjoyed watching the Ten Ten theatre company's performance on Monday and the show at the Beggars. We have enjoyed creating some instructions on how to plant a sunflower, we have also been labelling the plant. Next week we will be looking at the hungry caterpillar story. In maths we have been looking at time in particular o'clock. Have a lovely weekend.

Year 1: The children have had a great first week back, with the TenTen Theatre visit and a performance at the Beggars! We have also started our new topic on Beatrix Potter, the children have love finding out about her and her home in the Lake District. Next week is the Phonics Screening in Year 1; the children have been having great fun with phonics games and are more than prepared for this ten minute job next week. Thank you to all the parents who have read with their child over the holidays – we really appreciate it. I have taken the books out of the children's bags as they will be regrouped following the Screening next week. We hope you have a lovely weekend!

Year 2: We have had a very busy first week back to school. We are writing a lost and found story and the ideas the children have created are amazing. In maths we have been reading weights and answering lots of different questions. In Re we have been looking at Pentecost and discussing how the disciples felt we are going to write about this next week as one of the disciples. Everyone enjoyed our trip to the seaside we had a lovely time and the children worked in lots of different groups creating sculptures. Have a lovely weekend everyone! Persevering

Year 3: Children have had a good week back after half term. We have started looking at angles in Maths and children have been finding right angles. They are doing this for homework this week and children are bringing home their angle tester to help them. We have continued our writing on 'The tunnel' and have looked at another book by Anthony Browne called 'Into the Forest'. Next week we will finish this unit. We will also be completing some assessments next week in reading, maths and spelling, grammar and punctuation. Finally can we say congratulations to two of our Year 3 children, Madison and Hannah for competing as part of our Tennis Team. They won the Copeland finals and will be competing in the next round!

Year 4: We have had a great start back to school after the half term and the children have settled back into their work well. In Maths, we have looked at negative numbers and are now thinking about mass and converting kg into g and vice versa. In writing, we have been writing our own version of the balaclava boys, changing some of the details, to make it their own. In RE, we have been learning about St Stephen and how he showed courage in spreading the Good News. Due to a family bereavement, Fr Bob is unable to go on the Y6 trip to London so, at short notice, I have been asked to stand in. Mr McQuire will be teaching the class next week and will complete a mini topic on the Ancient Egyptians. I'm sure that the children will enjoy their week with him! <p>NO DOGS IN THE PLAYGROUND. THANK YOU: Can we please ask that you do not bring dogs into the playground when you are picking children up from school or dropping them off. Thank you.</p>	
<p>ILLNESS: Please remember to ring into school in the morning if your child is absent, stating the nature of their illness. Could we also remind you that if your child is absent due to sickness and / or diarrhoea, the recommended time they need to be absent from school is 48 hours from the last episode. This is to help reduce the spread of infection. Thank you for your help with this.</p>	
<p>SCHOOL UNIFORM: Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils; GIRLS UNIFORM: Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn. BOYS UNIFORM: Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks. All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather. LABELS: All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.</p>	<p>PE KITS: All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform. PE KIT: White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps. If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this. EARRINGS: Please remove your child's earrings on their PE days. And also on Swimming days. They will not be allowed to take part in PE lessons if they are wearing their earrings. Thank you.</p>
