

Uniform Policy

September 2015

Our policy has been created with value for money, health and safety and practicality at its heart. It is important that our children feel a sense of belonging and community through a smart and practical uniform. We believe a uniform allows all children, regardless of background, to feel equal to their peers and confident in their appearance. We also believe that setting high standards of dress helps to reinforce the high academic and social expectations we have of our children.

Our school colours are:

- Red sweatshirts
- Grey/black trousers and skirts
- Grey/black tights or leggings
- White polo shirts or shirts

Boys' uniforms are as follows:

- Red sweatshirt
- White polo shirt/shirt
- School book bag with school logo
- Grey/black trousers (Nursery **only** may wear jogging bottoms)
- Black shoes (No trainers or sandals)

Girls' uniforms are as follows:

- Red sweatshirt or cardigan
- White polo shirt/shirt or
- Red gingham dress
- School book bag with school logo
- Grey/black trousers, or
- Grey/black skirt
- Grey/black tights or leggings
- Black shoes (No trainers or sandals)
- **Optional:** fitted black headscarf (Available from school with logos)

PE kits are as follows:

- White/red T-shirt
- Black/blue shorts
 - Gym bag
- Suitable trainers (Not studded football boots)
- In winter children will also need black/grey joggers and sweatshirts

PE kits should be kept at school all week and be fully named. Parents are responsible for ensuring their child brings their PE kit to school when needed.

Further considerations

Footwear

Only black shoes that are fit for weather conditions and playgrounds should be worn. Children are not permitted to wear trainers, sandals or other unsuitable footwear. If a child needs to wear wellington boots or warm boots to travel to school in comfort please ensure they have their normal school shoes with them to change into.

Jewellery

Children are not permitted to wear jewellery in the school grounds due to health and safety risks. If your child has recently had their ears pierced then they should wear studs until it is safe to remove them for school.

Make up

We do not consider make up appropriate and children are not permitted to wear any such products. However, there may be exceptions in extreme circumstances at the headteacher's discretion (i.e. a child may be permitted to cover heavy scarring / skin damage).

Labelling

All clothing and footwear should be clearly labelled with your child's name so that it can be easily identified if lost.

Religious items and clothing

We do not discriminate and welcome all pupils regardless of faith or belief. However, the school will also weigh the needs and rights of individual pupils against the cohesion and health and safety concerns of the entire school community. We recognise that some parents wish their children to wear headscarves in school but these should only ever be of the 'fitted' kind (Available from the school). Any jewellery worn for religious reasons must be concealed beneath clothing and be removable for PE.
