Reception: What a fantastic week in Reception. The children loved their school trip to Maryport aquarium on Wednesday. Their behaviour and manners were fantastic, what a lovely day! We have been experimenting with materials this week and making boats; we have enjoyed testing them to find out which one is the best for floating across our water tray. It was lots of fun! We have also had singing practices, play practices, PE and our end of year mass and awards ceremony. Well done to this year's winners. On Wednesday next week we have sports day this is in the afternoon and starting about 1pm.

Year 1: What a fantastic week Year 1 have had! We really enjoyed our trip to Beatrix Potter and the children were so well behaved as they moved between the train, boat and the walk up to the attraction. The children were so polite to other passengers around us and enjoyed telling them about Beatrix Potter and our topic. Next week it will be Sports Day on Wednesday afternoon; so please can the children have their PE kit and trainers all week as we will be having a practice before hand. NO DOGS IN THE PLAYGROUND. THANK YOU: Can we please ask that you do not bring dogs into the playground when you are picking children up from school or dropping them off. Thank you.

ILLNESS: Please remember to ring into school in the morning if your child is absent, stating the nature of their illness. **Could we also remind you that if your child is absent due to sickness and / or diarrhoea, the recommended time they need to be absent from school is 48 hours from the last episode.** This is to help reduce the spread of infection. Thank you for your help with this.

SCHOOL UNIFORM: Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils;
GIRLS UNIFORM: Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn.
BOYS UNIFORM: Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.
All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.
LABELS: All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

PE KITS: All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.
PE KIT: White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps.
If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.
EARRINGS: Please remove your child's earrings on their PE days. And also on Swimming days. They will not be allowed to take part in PE lessons if they are wearing their earrings. Thank you.
