Pupil Premium

We received an additional sum of money directly from the Government in our delegated budget entitled Pupil Premium. In the academic year 2015 – 2016 we had 6% of the school population entitled to this support. At Templewood we have used our Pupil Premium to impact on the standards and achievements of pupils throughout the school. We have focussed on providing extra interventions, including 1:1 tuition, small group work, counselling, educational trips and activities.

Impact

- This year those who receive the pupil premium grant have made expected progress or more than expected in all areas (S&L, maths, reading and writing)
- 4 children in year 6 have made the expected progress for KS2
- All pupils in Year 6 have achieved expected in the SATs (100 scaled score) in Reading, writing and SPaG. 1 didn't in Maths.
- Progress in Maths is lower, which is in line which what has been seen across the school
