Why are Wheatfield getting a Twitter account?

Twitter is a great way to share the fantastic learning your children get up to every day at Wheatfield. You can keep up-to-date with the latest happenings in the school, and share in your children's successes. Many other local schools are already utilising this fantastic tool to help connect parents and we feel it would be extremely beneficial.

Can everyone see the tweets?

No. We have a protected account. This means that the general public cannot see **any** of our tweets. Only our followers can see our tweets. These followers are carefully selected by members of staff. People with no link to our school and children will not be accepted to follow our tweets. (Please note: Children must be older than 13 to use Twitter)

We will **never** publish a child's full name on our Twitter account or publish children's names alongside photos. Further information can be found in our Acceptable Use policy.

Can I ask questions or 'talk' to someone via the school Twitter account?

No. Our twitter account is used solely to share with you the learning happening in school and to let you know of the latest happenings. We will not be able to send replies to tweets.

Do I still need to complete and return the forms even though I don't want to follow the school's Twitter account?

Yes. It is vitally important that we hold up-to-date information, including photo permissions, on your child's Emergency Contact Form. We must also have the signed policy returned to confirm that your child can use our ICT systems at school.
