



## Pupil Premium Funding 2016 - 2017

### Information for Parents: how we intend to spend our funding

Pupil Premium Funding is an extra grant that schools receive for each child who is in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM,) or if they have ever claimed Free School Meals in the previous 6 years (Ever 6). The grant received for these children is £1320 per pupil in 2016/17. A child who is classified as 'Looked After' (LAC) is entitled to £1900.

Pupil Premium will also be paid at a level of £300 per pupil if their parents are in the Services.

In 2016-2017, it is expected that Ibstock Junior School will receive Pupil Premium Funding of £48,260.

Schools are to decide themselves how this grant funding is to be spent. We want the progress of all Pupil Premium funded children to accelerate this year.

Governors have agreed that at Ibstock Junior School, the Pupil Premium Funding will be allocated in the following ways:

Activity	Cost	Why we think it will benefit
Additional Teaching Staff	£35,750	Releasing the Deputy Headteacher to have time to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Provide focused, 1:1 and small-group teaching for disadvantaged pupils. Another teacher will help the Deputy Head to deliver the intervention.</li><li>• Coach and mentor class teachers of pupil premium children in the successful strategies used last year.</li></ul>
Educational Visits, including residential	£3,000	School children can make greater progress as a result of having a wide range of opportunities to learn outside the classroom.
Support staff	£9,510	Time will be allocated to provide further interventions, such as reading coaching. Support staff may also work alongside Pupil Premium children in class to help them with their learning and learning behaviour.
Total funds	£48,260	

School staff and Governors will evaluate this spending very carefully to check that it has had the desired effect.
