## **Barnby Dun Primary Academy PE and Sport Vision Statement**

At **Barnby Dun Primary Academy**, we believe that Physical Education and sport play a vital role in the physical, social, emotional and intellectual development of children. Physical Education and sport are central in giving children the knowledge and understanding in order to make a positive impact on their own health and well-being. The physical education curriculum at **Barnby Dun Primary Academy** aims to provide children with the opportunity to take part in a wide range of sports and physical activities, carried out in a safe and supportive environment, where effort and hard-work, as well as success, is celebrated.

### **New National Curriculum aims from 2014**

- Competent pupils able to excel in a broad range of physical activities.
- Pupils have the ability to be physically active for sustained periods of time.
- Pupils to be able to engage in competitive sports and activities.
- Pupils to be supported to lead healthy and active lifestyles.

### **What is the Primary 'Sport Premium'?**

The new primary 'sport premium' funding for primary schools has been designed to help schools in a variety of ways. Some of the outcomes we hope to meet through the 'sport premium' funding are:

- Increased opportunities for competitive sport.
- Improved quality of teaching and learning in Primary Physical Education, including more dynamic exercise in lessons.
- Improvements in the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performances levels they are capable of.

### **Uses at BDPA for the Sports Premium funding**

- Hiring qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE. For example, coaches from Doncaster Rovers FC.

- Hiring a specialist PE/sports teacher to work across the Hungerhill pyramid one day a week.
- Purchase of 'Real P.E.' scheme, resources and training for all staff.
- Providing new or additional sport clubs.
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport for teachers.
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport. For example, cover for the P.E. leader to attend the Pyramid network.
- Participating in an increased amount of intra-school competitions- Dance mats, athletics, multi skills, netball, football, handball.
- Giving children opportunities to experience sports they are less familiar with, for example, golf.
- Bringing in specialist sports coaches to work with the children, alongside teachers.
- Resources for our whole school Healthy Living Fortnight in June.
