

PUPIL PREMIUM WEBSITE STATEMENT

In 2014-15 the allocation for Pupil Premium funding will be **£59,600** - £1300 per child receiving FSM/received in last six years, £1900 for children looked after or adopted from care.

In 2013-2014, the School's expenditure on Pupil Premium pupils was **£30,185**.

The Pupil Premium is grant funding and is in addition to the School's Delegated Budget. It is allocated to children from low-income families and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. Pupil Premium Funding is used to raise attainment, promote social skills, independent learning and positive behaviour in order to increase pupil progress.

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium funding is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

It is for the school to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent. However, schools will be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families.

In 2014/15 our planned Pupil Premium expenditure will be:

- To fund additional teaching assistant hours - **£50,000**
- To fund staffing for the provision of an indoor classroom at lunchtime- **£1200**
- To part fund the Deputy Head's salary to teach intervention and 'booster' groups - **£5000**
- To part fund an additional teacher's salary to teach intervention and 'booster' groups in year 6 - **£8,000**
- To part fund an additional part time teacher's salary to provide small group teaching to a target group of year 1 children - **£5000**
- One to one tuition for two CLA pupils - **£2000**
- To extend the provision of after school booster sessions for year 6 - **£1200**

- Resources for sensory circuit - **£50**
- Staff training Courses - **£1000**
- Resources - Brazilian Arts fortnight- enrichment activities and resources **£400**
- Assessment resources - **£500**
- Attendance rewards- **£1000**
- Further development of 'The Workshop' **£500** =**£75,850**

Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium funding - based on 2013/14 end of year teacher assessment data

- **End of year 1** - 5 children- in reading 2/5 made slightly below expected progress, 2/5 made expected progress, 1/5 made above expected progress. In writing, 2/5 made slightly below, 1/5 expected, 2/5 above. In maths, 2/5 expected , 3/5 above.
- **End of year 2** - 7 children - in reading, 3/7 made expected progress, 4/7 made above expected progress. In writing, 1/7 made expected progress, 6/7 made above expected progress. In maths, 3/7 below, 3/7 expected, 1/7 above expected.
- **End of year 3** -7 children - in reading, 2/7 made expected progress, 5/7 made above expected progress. In writing, 1/7 made below expected progress, 1/7 made expected progress, 5/7 made above expected progress. In maths 4/7 made expected progress, 3/7 made above expected progress.
- **End of year 4** -6 children - in reading 1/6 made below expected progress, 1/6 made expected, 4/6 made above expected progress. In writing, 1/6 made below expected, 2/6 made expected, 3/6 made above expected. In maths, 1/6 made below, 4/6 made expected, 1/6 made above expected progress.
- **End of year 5** - 5 children - in reading 2/5 made below expected progress, 1/5 expected, 2/5 made above expected progress. In writing, 1/5 made below expected, 2/5 made expected, 2/5 made above expected progress. In maths, 2/5 made below expected, 1/5 made expected, 2/5 made above expected.

- **End of year 6 (based on SATs tests)** - 7 children - in reading 5/7 made expected progress, 2/7 made above expected. In writing 5/7 made expected progress 2/7 made above expected. In maths 1/7 made below expected progress, 6/7 made expected progress,

All children have benefitted greatly from excellent pastoral support.

Attendance in school for 2013/14 is 97.8% which is considerably above the National Average. This was the highest in Doncaster Local Authority.
