Dear Parents/Guardians,

Home learning in Year 4

MATHS

Maths homework will go out on a **TUESDAY** and will be due in on a **FRIDAY**.

This will usually be a worksheet that will be stuck in their maths homework books.

LITERACY

Literacy homework will go out on a **THURSDAY** and will be due in on a **TUESDAY**.

Literacy home learning will vary between reading comprehension, grammar and punctuation and writing tasks. When answering comprehension questions, please make sure answers are written in full sentences.

SPELLING

Spellings will be handed out on a **FRIDAY** and books will be collected in and children tested the following **FRIDAY**. Children will be given a list of spellings to learn that will be stuck into their spelling homework book. In addition, they should write a good quality sentence including each spelling in their books.

The home learning task will be related to learning covered in class, and will be explained when handed out - should your child not understand the task, they should ask their teacher before it goes home.

All home learning should be completed in **pencil**, and a ruler used for drawing lines. We expect neat handwriting and for all tasks to be completed to a high standard, including writing **a date** at the top of work.

Please also **try to read with your child every day**, and ensure that an adult records the reading and signs the home link book. This is so that your child can progress in the Reading Race. Points are awarded for each time your child reads, and they will receive a certificate as they progress through each stage. Reading records will be checked on **FRIDAY** for both in **4P and 4J**.

Please ensure your child brings their Home-School Link Book into school **every day**.

Any child that does not complete their home learning will be expected to do it over lunch time. They may also voluntarily attend home learning club before their work is due in at lunchtime, should they find this a useful alternative to completing it at home.
