Reception: We have had such a busy week in Reception watching two shows! The first was a surprise performance of Beauty and the Beast on Tuesday afternoon, and on Wednesday morning we enjoyed our annual visit from the Magic Carpet Theatre! Thank you so much for all of your cake and money donations sent in on Friday for our 'Brighten Up for Harvest' day – we are very grateful. The children were sent home with their phonics homework book and their reading book on Friday. Unfortunately, we are unable to send home reading books if your child does not bring in a reading bag. Please can you make sure that your child's reading book is in their book bag every day so that they can take part in daily reading activities, and also so we can change their books when necessary. We hope you have a lovely weekend!

(Sounds taught in phonics so far: s,a,t,p,i,n).

Year 1: It has been a really busy and exciting week in year 1. On Tuesday we had a lovely surprise visit from the M and M theatre company, watching their production of Beauty and the Beast; we all thoroughly enjoyed this. On Wednesday we had a visit from the Magic Carpet company and their production of 'The Magic Circus' we all really enjoyed watching that too. We have enjoyed writing our own versions of 'How to catch a star' this week and have produced some very inspiring ideas. Next week we will be starting a new book 'The Way Back Home'. In Maths we have been looking at ordering numbers to 50 and writing them. We have started looking at missing numbers too; I have sent some to try at home for homework. We will continue with this next week. We have made a great start to our space topic and enjoyed watching video clips of space; we completed a great piece of science work based on the planets in our solar system.

Mrs South's phonics group – Recapped sounds: 'e' 'u' 'b' 'r' 'h'. Miss Cook's phonics group – Recapped sounds: 'ai' 'ee' 'igh' 'oa' 'oo'. Miss Carters phonics group – New words: some come Sounds recapped: ur er. Next week we will start sending home weekly spellings to learn and practice. They will go out on a Monday and the children will have a test on Friday. Have a lovely weekend.

Year 2: In Literacy we have been looking at features of newspaper reports and this week we are going to plan and create some of our own linked to familiar stories we know. In maths we are adding two digit numbers in different ways including renaming. Can children practice counting forwards and backwards from different two digit numbers as this is something we are practicing daily and extra practice at home will really help. In RE we are re-telling the story about Daniel in the Lions den. We are thinking about how he felt and how the King felt when he had to put him in the den of Lions. In Science we have been looking at mini beasts in their habitats and thinking about why different insects and animals live in different places. We are going to continue with this and compare different habitats and animals that live in them such as tropical rain forests and the Polar regions. Have a great weekend.

Year 3: It's been a hectic week in Year three this week on Monday morning children went to Mass and can we say a massive thank you to all the children who brought in cakes from home – it is very much appreciated and the parishioners loved them! On Monday afternoon, we went up to the Beggar's theatre to watch a performance of Bardolf's Box and on Tuesday and Wednesday we were lucky enough to watch two performances by the 'Magic Carpet' theatre! The children thoroughly enjoyed these performances! On Wednesday afternoon, we went on our walk to Hodbarrow, looked at the area we have been discussing in class and did some sketching. Finally on Friday, we finished with our Harvest Fast day in aid of CAFOD – again thank you to all who contributed to the day! Next week looks to be a little more 'normal'. In literacy we have started a new unit on writing instructions and we will be investigating these a little more. In maths, we will continue with addition.

Year 4: It has been a busy week in Year 4! On Monday we had a trip to the Beggar's Theatre to watch *Bardolf's Box* and then on Wednesday the circus came to town when the Magic Carpet Theatre Company came to perform for us at school. The children had a great time and really enjoyed watching both performances! In literacy we have finished our work on quest tales and have now moved on to looking at newspaper reports. We have also started some new work in maths this week as we have been thinking about addition calculations and our nine times table. On Monday Year 4 are going to mass at 9am. Please can you ensure that your child is in school by 8:45am so that we can register the class and get across to church on time. There will be a Facebook page set up in the next few days called 'St James Year 4'. This will be a closed group for parents to join so that I can share information with you and so that you can see pictures of the children taking part in school activities. I hope you all have a lovely weekend!

Year 5: What a busy week we've had with theatre visits and fitting in all out classwork. This coming week, we will be changing our maths focus to addition. We will be looking at the column method and building on the skills which the children already have. Any extra work at home and on Mathletics will be of great benefit to them. In Literacy, we will end our story writing unit with the children writing their own mystery story; we will then be switching our focus to non-fiction texts and explanations in particular. Have a great weekend!

Year 6: It's been a particularly hectic week in year 6. On Monday, the children took part in the Year of Mercy pilgrimage to Lancaster Cathedral. On Tuesday, they visited Lancaster Castle, where they found out about how the justice system in Lancaster. They were able to visit the two courtrooms, still in use today, and many chose to find out what it was like to be locked up in a medieval cell! On Wednesday, the children enjoyed a performance by the Magic Carpet Theatre Company and on Friday they watched a Science show brought to them by the Science Museum in London. We have also found time to start our work on journalistic writing, and in Maths we have started our work on multiplication. Extra tables practise this weekend would be really helpful this weekend! I hope you all have a great weekend.

On Wednesday we had our whole school performance of 'The Magic Circus' from the Magic Carpet Theatre Company which the children really had fun watching as always. On Friday 7th we had our Harvest Fast Day in aid of CAFOD. It was lovely to see the children in their brightly coloured clothes. SCHOOL UNIFORM: Just a reminder of our official school uniform which should be worn by all pupils;

GIRLS UNIFORM: Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn.

BOYS UNIFORM: Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks.
All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.

LABELS: All uniform should have your child's name on it. Please also label coats and pumps.

PE KITS: All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform.

PE KIT: White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps.

If your child does not have their kit, they will not be able to do PE. This includes pumps or trainers. Thanks for your help with this.

EARRINGS

Please remove your child's earrings on PE days. And also on Swimming days. Children will not be allowed to take part in PE lessons if they are wearing their earrings. Our school policy is that staff does not remove earrings for the children and that a plaster covering the earring is not sufficient. Thank you.
