Teaching and Learning Policy

Values

Teaching

We will teach our children by ensuring that:

- there is purposeful and effective use of support staff to promote children's learning

Learning Environment

We will provide for our children:

- working walls to support children's learning English yellow, Maths blue, Science Green, RE red
- clearly labelled accessible resources
- an accessible Dyslexia toolkit
- a purposeful working atmosphere appropriate to the task
- a clearly displayed visual timetable
- a welcoming reading area in each classroom
- a reflective area in each classroom
- a clearly displayed 'Good to be Green' chart
- a clearly displayed set of Good to be Green rules
- a display of 'Our experts' to celebrate children's success
- a celebration of children's work in the classrooms and corridors
- a learning styles display
- a growth mindset display

In each classroom we will have a working wall for English, Maths, Science and RE. Working walls to include:

In each classroom the following resources will be available:

- Plenty of practical maths resources
- Dictionaries, thesauruses, spelling resources

- Dyslexia toolkit

Curriculum Structure

Our curriculum is designed to be broad and balanced and based on the National Curriculum.

We will teach English and Maths daily; Science, RE, Computing and PE will be taught weekly. KS2 will also have a weekly session of Spanish.

All other subjects will be taught in a cross curricular way but mainly through our termly collapsed curriculum weeks, where each class will focus on a particular topic.

Each of our lessons will contain:

- opportunities for the children to respond to feedback given and provided with further challenge
- new learning where knowledge, skills and understanding will be taught and practiced.

Each of our English and maths lessons will also contain:

a basic skills session to consolidate and practice basic skills

Each maths lesson will also include a counting/times tables activity.

Use of Teaching Assistants

We will ensure that all teaching assistants within lesson time:

- are providing support for children's learning
- are fully engaged with the learning
- help children develop their independent learning skills and manage their own learning
- are well prepared for the lesson
- act as a good role model for the children, demonstrating good behaviour and manners
