Background: In April 2013, the Government announced new funding for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of. **At Harefield Junior School we are using the fund to improve the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles:**

Harefield Junior School has been allocated £9295 for the Academic Year 2013-14. This will be given in two portions. £5694 in the financial year 2013-14 and the balance of £3601 will be given in April/May 2014 (totalling £9295). Government confirmed continuance of this grant.
