Reception: We have had a great week thinking about autumn and how the trees change. We have made some 'Leaf Men', painted trees, leaf necklaces and had a go at describing some beautiful autumn leaves. Next week we will be continuing with our autumn theme and will be listening to the story of the Owl Babies. As part of this, we are hoping to build some large nests so if anyone has any large boxes e.g. fruit boxes, then we would be really grateful if you could bring them in for us to use! Children have also started looking at reading books at school and at home. If you read the school book with your child or even share your own books with your child, please could you write in the yellow Reading Record that is sent home. I hope you have a lovely weekend, and I am looking forward to seeing you all at Parent's Evening next week!

(Sounds from phonics this week: s, a, t, p, i, n).

Year 1: The children are continuing to work very hard in Year One. We have enjoyed starting our new book *The Way Back Home*; we have created some interesting aliens and their descriptions. The children enjoyed describing some fantasy land pictures; we will continue with this next week. In maths we have been looking at sequencing numbers within 50 and finding the missing number or where the numbers have gone wrong. Next week we will move onto number stories and addition. In RE we will be looking at 'love' and who we love and how we show love to people. Well the children have enjoyed learning their spellings this week and enjoyed taking the spelling test on Friday. In phonics this week we have been covering:

Mrs South's group: new word – 'there' recapped all phase 3 sounds ai ee igh oa oo or ar oi ow ur er sh ch th ng qu ck ff ll zz ss

Miss Carter's group: recapped sounds – or ar oi ow Miss Cook's group: recapped sounds – f l j v w Have a lovely weekend!

Year 2: The children have been working hard again in year 2. This coming week in maths, we will be competing adding 2 digits using remaining and counting backwards – please try this at home with your child. In literacy we will be completing newspaper reports using exciting ideas and creating some linked to the Great Fire of London. We will be looking at different long phoneme 'I' spelling patterns again for spelling this week. We will be completing the Great Fire of London work by making an art display for our classroom. In science we will be looking at animal habitats in different places of the world. We will discover what they eat and need to survive.

Thank you for returning your parent evening slips, I look forward to meeting you all next week.

Year 3: Children have continued to work hard in Year three this week. We have completed a unit on addition in maths and have started some subtraction on Thursday and Friday. In Literacy we have been planning our instructions for 'How to trap a troll!' We have really concentrated on the features of instructions and also how we can use strong imperative verbs and careful adverbs to help the reader. In Science we have carried on with our rocks and soils topic and children may have brought home some instructions for how to make a compost bin! This is not compulsory, but if any of you do have a go, then please bring them in to show! Next week, we look forward to seeing you all at parents evening – you should have returned your slips and will get your time early next week. Have a lovely weekend!

Year 4: Year 4 have been investigating the features used in newspaper articles this week. Then, on Friday, we began to plan our own newspaper reports based on the poem 'Little Red Riding Hood and the Wolf' by Roald Dahl. The children really enjoyed this poem and are excited to write about it! In maths we have continued with our work on column addition. The children have grasped this well and produced some really great work. In RE we have been thinking about the Bible and how God speaks to us through it. This week we looked at the story of Joseph and his coat of many colours. Next week we will be using Bible references to locate passages in the Bible. I am looking forward to meeting with you all at Parents Evening next week and hope that you have a lovely weekend!

Year 5: This week we have worked hard on our column addition skills and the children are now able to add some rather large numbers – you will see this when they complete this week's homework! This coming week we will looking at subtraction using the column method. In Literacy, the children produced some great stories with a twist at the end and this week we will be moving on to look at explanations texts. In RE, we will be thinking about how we are called to be Stewards of the Earth and what this means for us as Christians. In Science, we will be thinking about and finding out about why we experience night and day. Have a great weekend everyone!

Year 6: It doesn't seem possible that we are approaching half term; the weeks have flown by! We start next week by going to Mass on Monday morning. This is a change to the dates listed on the newsletter. As Mass starts at 9am, could all the children try to come into school for 8:45, so that they can be registered and lunches ordered before we leave? We will be continuing our work on multiplication next week in maths and in Literacy, we will continue with our work on Newspaper reports. In our topic work, we will be using source material from the National Archives to find out about how crime changed in the 20th century. I am looking forward to seeing you all next week at Parents' evening. Have a great weekend!
