Reception

This week we have been finding lots of shapes around the school, maybe you could help your child to find different 2D shapes at home and they could share their findings when they come back after the holidays? Thank you to everyone who has been reading with their child at home, we are really seeing a difference in the children with the way they are handling books and having a go at reading the sounds they have been taught. Year 1

A lovely week to end this half term. We have written some lovely stories about the way back home. We have just started counting on from a given number and solving number sentences like this. I have sent this home for homework. Remind your child to start with the bigger number and count on.

After half term we will start our new topic – 'light and dark.' The first book we will start with is the 'Owl afraid of the dark.' In maths we will continue with counting on. In RE we will begin a unit on Mary our Mother. Have a lovely half term.

Year 2

Thank you all for coming to the Parents meetings this week it was nice to meet you all and discuss your children. This week we have completed our newspaper reports writing about the crime scene that took place outside our door on Thursday morning. This was linked to Mr Egg from a new story book. The children were really excited and had some great ideas. In maths we have completed our addition work for this half term and it would help if the children can continue practicing this at home. In RE we have looked at the story of Joseph and why he was chosen by God. The children have designed their own coats for Joseph from this work which we have started to show on our display. Our science topic will continue next half term where we are going to be looking at food chains and then designing our own animals and habitats.

In our topic work the children made advertisements for different types of air raid shelters on Friday. I know they are all really excited for our World War Two trip to Tullie House after half term. Over half term I have asked the children to practice their times tables using Mathletics, read regularly and complete a book review for our class book *Friend or Foe* by Michael Morpurgo. I have sent the final chapter home with the children to read with you. Thank you all very much for coming to parents' evening; it was lovely to chat with you all and share your child's progress. I hope you all enjoy your half term!

Year 5

What a busy half term it has been. It was great to speak to you all at parent's evening to discuss how the children are getting on. As we move into the next half term, we will be continuing to look at subtraction in maths, with a focus on solving problems and in Literacy, we will be thinking about explanation texts. I won't be sending any homework for the half term but I would like for the children to keep up with their daily reading and times tables practice – 7s and 8s especially please!

On the Monday when we return after half term, Y5 will be attending Mass over in church at 9am. Could I therefore please ask that the children are in school no later than 8.45am. This will also be Y5's turn to provide refreshments for the parishioner so any donations of cakes would be greatly appreciated. Thank for your help with this. Have a great half term!

Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights.
