

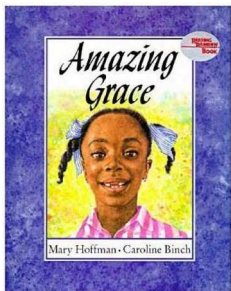


Week 1

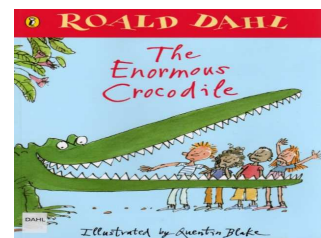
Fri 16th Sept: dress up day
