 Attendance is notably lower this week than during all of last term. Please do your best to get your child to school on time every day.

Bump notes: Children often have bumps and scrapes as part of their daily lives. In school we record incidents which children report or which are witnessed by staff on an accident slip and attach it in your home-school link book. That way you see it when your child gets home. We don't write up every grazed finger, but do endeavour to let you know about a bumped head, cut lip, badly grazed elbow or knee, and also anything not immediately visible, such as bruising under clothes or bangs to the mouth. If the accident is more than minor, staff will S COON make every attempt to contact you straight away. Please let us know if something happens at home that might affect your child's well-being in school. Midday Supervisor: The closing date is 6 Nov for the vacancy for a midday supervisor at CE school.
