

Sports Premium Overview

September 2016 to August 2017

The School:

At Warmsworth Primary School we believe PE and Sport plays an integral role in and has the potential to change young people's lives for the better. We recognise that PE plays an important role in the health and wellbeing of children and the positive impact PE and extra-curricular activities can have on the attitudes, confidence and academic achievement of all our children.

We have been committed to using the Sports Premium funding to improve our provision of Physical Education and sport throughout our school.

Sports Premium Grant:

The government provides funding jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, to see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil.

What does the Sports Premium mean for my school?

'Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.'

At school we have split up the funding by three key areas for consideration; Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive sport. We have decided to spend the Sports Premium Grant on:

Physical Education: To improve the quality of Teaching and Learning in physical education

Objective	Outcomes

Healthy Active Lifestyles: Ensuring all our children have access to regular exercise.

Objective	Outcomes
<p>To increase activity levels at lunchtime and have access to regular exercise after school.</p> <p>Actions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Promote PE activities during KS2 assembly on Tuesdays. • JHSC employed to work during lunchtimes Monday-Friday providing opportunities for children to engage in a wider range of physical activities. <p>Amount: £4875.00</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • More children engaging in physical activity during these times. • Improved behaviour in the playground/lesson times. • Improved focus in lesson times. • Developing team work skills.

Competitive School Sport: Increasing pupil's participation in extra-curricular sport.

Objective

To increase the opportunities for children to take part in competitive sporting activities/festivals.
To maintain the Sainsbury's School Games Mark Bronze award. Working towards achieving Silver level.
Actions:

- Compete in a full range of 'pyramid events calendar events.
- Opportunities to enter and compete in Sir Thomas Wharton Pyramid and other pyramid competitions.
- Engage in virtual inter-school competitions for multi-skill events.
- Work with Doncaster School Games Organiser-Craig Dallas

Amount: £1300.00

Outcomes

- Children have the opportunity to compete in a wider range of competitions.
- A higher proportion of children take part in a wide range of different sporting competitions. 30% increase in children participating in competitions.
- Compete in Active Fusion school competition calendar.
