P.E Report 2014/15

At Hawksworth CE Primary School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

Amount Received

The 2014-2015 Sport Premium funding for Hawksworth CE Primary School was a block sum of £8000 plus £5 per pupil on roll, resulting in a total of £8550.

What was the 2014/15 PE funding spent on?

The funding was used for:

1. Tong High School Partnership – As a school we have continued our Accelerate Sports Partnership with the PE department at Tong High School – £5000. This partnership continues to provide a tailored PE training/CPD for our teachers, a specialist PE teacher to teach a weekly PE lesson to each of our classes, the continuation of an after school sports club for our Key Stage One children, our children attending the annual award ceremony for 'Excellence in P.E' and a range of opportunities for our school to be involved in numerous sports competitions and events.
2. New equipment and resources for outdoor education - £850.
3. New sports equipment - £750
4. Cricket club – An after school Cricket club has been continued for 2014/15 and our sport premium has enabled this club to be free to all our Key Stage 2 pupils - £1000.
5. Transport - We have used our Sport Premium to cover transport costs for our pupils to and from sporting competitions in Leeds and the surrounding areas £400.

6. Strategic Planning - Part of our funding has been used to release members of staff to assess and analyse our current PE and school sport provision - £450.

7. Mr Alex Hall our P.E specialist from Tong High School and he has worked alongside the Hawksworth staff to support planning and the delivery of PE (2014/15) He has also run a weekly after school club, 'The Mini Movers' for the Key Stage 1 children.

Impact:

- The profile of P.E. within school has continued to increase.
- A more inclusive curriculum which inspires and engages all pupils.
- Teacher training continues to increase the confidence and skills of class teachers in delivering high quality PE lessons.
- Developed confidence amongst staff in the teaching and assessment of PE.
- The curriculum has been enriched with opportunities for pupils to participate in sporting events
- The range, variety, quality and expertise of after school sporting provision has been enhanced.
- More children are able to participate in sport outside of school.
- Children now have the opportunity to access experiences that they may not otherwise have been able to, through the development of intra and inter school competitions.
- Children have had the honour and take pride in representing their school.
- Pupil concentration, commitment, self-esteem and behaviour enhanced.
- Positive behaviour and a sense of fair play enhanced.
- Increased opportunities for pupils with sporting talents to compete with pupils with similar levels of skills.
- Opportunities for 'vulnerable' groups and less confident individuals to participate in sporting activities, which would otherwise be beyond their means.
- Children have access to more healthy lifestyle activities as a result of an increased range of after school clubs
- Children are now more aware of the importance of keeping a physical and active healthy lifestyle.
