

# Hawksworth CE Primary School

## P.E Report 2013/14

At Hawksworth CE Primary School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

### Amount Received

The 2013-2014 Sport Premium funding for Hawksworth CE Primary School was a block sum of £8000 plus £5 per pupil on roll, resulting in a total of £8455.

### What was the 2013/14 PE funding spent on?

The funding was used for:

1. New Gymnastics Equipment - As a school we felt that some of our Gymnastics equipment was limited and outdated so we have spent £1800 buying in new equipment and resources that we feel will improve the teaching of Gymnastics and enthuse our pupils.
2. Tong High School Partnership – As a school we have bought in to the Accelerate Sports Partnership that is run by the PE department at Tong High School – £3000. This partnership has resulted in tailored PE training/CPD for our teachers, a specialist PE teacher to teach a weekly PE lesson to each of our classes, the establishment of an after school sports club for our Key Stage One children, our children being involved in the annual award ceremony for ‘Excellence in P.E’ and opportunities for our school to be involved in a wide range of sports competitions and events.
3. New equipment and resources for indoor/outdoor P.E provision - £2000.
4. Playtime and Lunchtime equipment - £500.
5. New Cricket club – An after school Cricket club has been established and we have used our sport premium to enable this club to be free to all our Key Stage 2 pupils - £510.

6. Transport - We have used our Sport Premium to cover transport costs for our

pupils to and from sporting competitions in Leeds and the surrounding areas - £310.

8. Strategic Planning - Part of our funding has been used to release members of staff to assess and analyse our current PE and school sport provision - £300.

### Impact:

- The profile of P.E. within school has increased.
- A more inclusive curriculum which inspires and engages all pupils..
- Teacher training has increased the confidence and skills of class teachers in delivering high quality PE lessons.
- Developed confidence amongst staff in the teaching and assessment of PE.
- The curriculum has been enriched with opportunities for pupils to participate in sporting events
- The range, variety, quality and expertise of after school sporting provision has been enhanced.
- More children are able to participate in sport outside of school.
- Children now have the opportunity to access experiences that they may not otherwise have been able to, through the development of intra and inter school competitions.
- Children have had the honour and take pride in representing their school.
- Pupil concentration, commitment, self-esteem and behaviour enhanced.
- Positive behaviour and a sense of fair play enhanced.
- Increased opportunities for pupils with sporting talents to compete with pupils with similar levels of skills.
- Opportunities for 'vulnerable' groups and less confident individuals to participate in sporting activities, which would otherwise be beyond their means.
- Children have access to more healthy lifestyle activities as a result of an increased range of after school clubs
- Children are now more aware of the importance of keeping a physical and active healthy lifestyle.
