Reception: We have a great week in Reception, where we have been learning a new story – The Little Red Hen. The children are learning this off by heart; maybe you could ask them to show you what they know so far as we will be continuing this next week! In Maths next week we will be looking at the properties of 2D shapes, if the children find any 2D shapes at home, could they draw a picture of the shapes and you could support them by labelling what the object is. In RE we will be continuing to think about how to share love with our families and friends. I hope you have a lovely weekend!

(Phonics: Revision Week: s,a,t,p,i,n,m,g,d,o,c,k,ck,e,r,u. Tricky words: the, was, my, me, I)

Year 1 We have had a great week in year one; we have drawn our story of the owl afraid of the dark to a close this week and have created some beautiful art work for our wall. We have been writing speech and describing the owl using similes. This was lots of fun! In Maths we have been writing and making our own number sentence problems for our friends to solve – perhaps you could ask your child to think of a number sentence for you to solve at home. Phonics work this week: tricky words covered - Miss Carters group: had, him, not, got. Miss Cooks group: little, come, some, have. Mrs South's group: was, you, they all. Please remember it is important to practice spellings with your child. Have a lovely weekend!

Year 2: Next week we are continuing with our subtraction work in Maths. In Literacy we are looking at noun phrases and speed between 2 characters. In RE we are going to read the opening of the Nativity story. We are working hard with our plan, can you make sure that all of the children practice their line every day at home as this will help them to remember them. Homework is finding numbers from a number square. Have a good weekend.

Year 3: Children have been working hard this week learning and practising their three times tables. At the end of the week we started to look at how to complete short multiplication. This will continue next week as we also add our four times tables in! This weekend, children will bring home their four times table's cards home to learn. As with the threes, can we please make sure they are brought to school each day. In Literacy, we have begun planning and writing our own versions of a story where a monster or beast is defeated! We look forward to finalising these next week. In Science, we have moved onto looking at our skeleton and the functions of this. Have a lovely weekend everyone.

Year 4: Year 4 has been busy this week! In literacy we have been practising writing to create suspense. The children have really enjoyed this and produced some lovely work. We will be looking at using our new skills with suspense writing next week when the children move on to planning and writing their own tale of fear. In maths we began looking at multiplication and the children have coped with this well. Next week we will be thinking about multiplying 2-digit numbers. Knowing their times tables will really help the children with this work, so any extra practice at home would be fantastic. I hope you all have a lovely weekend!

Year 5: This coming week we will be writing our own explanation texts and hopefully showing everything that we have learnt over the past three weeks. In maths, we will be learning about prime, square and cube numbers as part of your worm on multiplication – could you please make a big effort to help your children learn their times tables. These children with good times tables knowledge are finding out multiplication work much easier! On Monday, the whole school will be going to Mass as part of the Year of Mercy. Please do join us if you can. Could you please send in any donations for our class stall at the Christmas fair – in aid of subsidising our residential trip to Lockerbie and any donations for our Bake Off hamper. Thank you for all of your help and support in these things, it really is appreciated. Have a great weekend!

Year 6: We have had a great week in year 6. We are all very proud of the children who represented St James' in the STEM challenge at Millom School on Wednesday. They were awarded 3rd place overall, with a special mention for Jansen, who was a very impressive group leader. We have also finished packing up 8 shoeboxes to go to help Syrian children this Christmas. This has linked very well with our new RE topic, Justice, where we are learning about injustice in the world and what we can do to help. In our topic work next week, we will be finding out more about how our food is digested. In maths we will be dividing and in Literacy we will be finishing our work on explanations. Thank you for your contributions for the Christmas themed hamper. Any final contributions will be much appreciated before the school Christmas fair on November 27th. I hope you all have a great weekend.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Our Breakfast Club runs every week day when we are at school from 8am and costs £1 per child per day, which is payable daily or weekly / termly in advance please.
