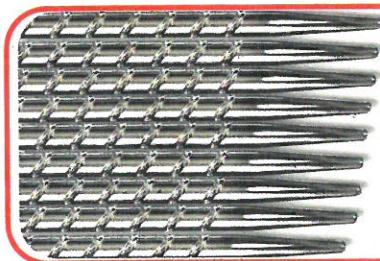

The Facts Of Lice...

- Head lice are small, wingless, greyish-white insects, no bigger than a grain of rice. They are hard to detect, but our comb finds and removes them, even in thick or curly hair
- We all call them nits, when really we mean head lice. A nit is the empty egg case left attached to a single strand of hair after each head louse is hatched. Our comb gets those out, too
- Head lice suck blood directly from our scalps and live their entire lives in our hair. They can't survive anywhere else
- Mature female head lice lay about 4 to 6 eggs daily, attaching each one to a single hair strand, close to the scalp, where it hatches close to their food source... which is our blood. Eee-Yuck!
- Itching is an allergic reaction to the head louse's feeding, and not everyone suffers from it. So check regularly at bath or shower-time with our comb to be sure your family stays NitFree
- They don't leap, hop or fly, live on pets or hide in pillowcases, sofa cushions or hats. So no need to boil the bedding
- They move to a new host during even very brief head-to-head contact - which is why younger children get infested so often during school or play
- Killing or removing the head lice alone is not enough. If you don't remove the 'live' eggs as well, you're still infested and the new lot will hatch out a week to ten days later
- Long or short, clean or dirty, boys' or girls', straight or curly, they don't prefer any one type of hair.
