The Infant Award

The children will need to show us that they are consistently demonstrating each of the values - friendship, honesty, caring, responsibility, perseverance and respect. The children will receive a special "Helping Hands" stamp on their certificate if they impress their teachers. If the children receive 1 stamp in every value by the end of the year, they will receive a bronze medal. If they achieve 2 stamps in every value, they will receive a silver medal and if they have excelled and achieved 3 stamps in every value, they will receive a gold medal.

The Junior Award

The junior children will have an extra challenge! In each of the values on their certificate is a task to accomplish. Some tasks will be achieved through a class activity but most are for the children to decide if they want to volunteer or participate. Many tasks can be completed at school but there are jobs that can be volunteered for at home (parents may like this one) or accomplishments achieved outside of school that can be recognised.

For each year group, there are slightly different tasks. By Year 6, the tasks will require more independence, self-organisation and collaboration - skills that they can take forward to secondary school and beyond.

To achieve a bronze medal, the junior children will need to achieve the tasks for 2 values, for the silver medal, achieve 4 values, and for the gold medal, achieve all 6 values.

We will celebrate the children's achievements in a special Celebration Medal Ceremony at the end of the year. We are sure they will all try their best!



Please take a look at the certificates. The junior ones have the tasks included on them. If they choose to do a help at home role, they will take a letter home to explain the task and ask parents to confirm when it has been completed.
