



HOMEWORK POLICY

Purpose of homework

- To support learning that has already taken place in the classroom
- To develop skills that are used on a daily basis
- To provide an opportunity for older children to develop research skills

Homework in the Foundation Stage

- Children take home a reading scheme book once a week
- Children take home a class library book once a week
- Children are given key words to learn

Homework at Key Stage One

- Children take home a reading scheme book once a week
- Children take home a class library book once a week
- Children take home differentiated spellings weekly
- If appropriate, children may take home multiplication tables to practice

Homework at Key Stage Two

- Children will take home a book from the class library weekly
- Y3 and children on the SEN register will take reading scheme books as appropriate
- Children take home a set of differentiated spellings weekly
- Children are asked constantly to practice multiplication tables
- Children are encouraged to research topics that are being covered in class and to report their findings to their teacher and peers
- Year 6 will be given additional work to support SATs preparation

Completing School Work

- At both key stages, where a class teacher feels that a child has not put enough effort into a piece of work, the work will be sent home. On these occasions the work will be accompanied by a slip of paper explaining why the work has been sent home and asking parents to ensure it is completed that evening.
