Measuring the impact of PPG spending

As a result of the resources purchased and the interventions carried out the impact of the PPG for 2014-15 was as follows:

- 100% of children receiving PPG made National Expected progress in Reading
- 100% of children receiving PPG made National Expected progress in Writing
- 100% of children receiving PPG made National Expected progress in maths.
- 100% of children receiving PPG made above National Expected progress in Reading.
- 90% of children receiving PPG made above National Expected progress in Writing.
- 90% of children receiving PPG made above National Expected progress in Maths.
