Summary of PPG Spending

Spending in the Financial year 2015/16 was targeted towards:

- supporting the existing class structure, in terms of Class Teacher and in-class Teaching Assistant staffing, so that children attracting PPG can continue to be taught in small classes with guaranteed additional challenge, attention and appropriate differentiation in the classroom;
- the continued evaluation and provision of small group and one-to-one interventions in Reading and Maths aimed at a) narrowing the gap between PPG pupils and their peers and b) providing challenge for more able pupils;
- subsidising the school trips in Class 1 and Class 2, and the residential visit in Class 3 so that no families will be treated differently as a result of inability to pay;
- subsidising access to instrumental music lessons;
- further building emotional resilience and self-esteem;
- increasing attendance and sustaining improved attendance; and
- supporting pupils at risk of exclusion or those vulnerable at transition.

Outcomes and Achievements to Date:

- Most eligible children who had been on roll for more than 2 academic years are doing as well as, or better than their peers. As of July 16, 60% PPG pupils in YR, 2, 4 and 6 were at the new expected standard for Reading, Writing and Maths compared to 54% of all pupils in those year groups. This can be evidenced by the school's pupil tracking records.
- Of the eligible children who have not achieved so well, 2 have additional complex needs and are receiving addition support, which includes additional advice from the Educational psychologist.
- At KS2 we have recorded a reduction in the difference in attainment between PPG children and all others from 2015 to 2016.

- Able pupils eligible for PPG were appropriately challenged and achieved at least the expected standards in Reading, Writing and Maths combined, despite the raised expectations this year.
- AT KS1 there were no PPG pupils in July 2016, however at the end of YR, 100% of PPG children achieved a Good Level of Development.
- All eligible children were able to take part in class trips or residential visits.
- Two eligible children were able to take private music lessons in school.
- In addition, one child was able to take surf lessons.
- Of the children accessing pastoral, emotional or counselling support, 3 are eligible children.
- Two eligible children were supported through transition to another class/school by personalised transition arrangements.
- There were no exclusions.
